15,000 Sudeten Jews Flee as Nazis Enter

Council Forms Refugee Groups

PRAHA. — The number of Jewish refugees from Sudeten German districts is now estimated at 15,000 of a total Jewish population in those areas expected to be annexed to Germany of 22,000. About 9,000 of the refugees are now in this city.

The Supreme Council of Jewish Communities has formed a refugee committee, placing as its disposal 80,000 kronen (about \$2,800) for immediate relief purposes. A second committee has been formed by the Jewish Party and the Zionist Organization to negotiate with the authorities for housing accommodation. Jewish leaders are discussing a plan to settle the Sudeten Jews in Carpatho, Russia, which is sparsely inhabited and offers good economic possibilities.

A complete district list of Jews and German and Czech Social Democrats (socialists,) apparently compiled in expectation German troops would soon march in, was found in a government search of abandoned Sudeten German party headquarters at Duchcov (Dux).

AMA Asks Tolerance For Refugee Doctors

CHICAGO. — "Careful, sympathetic consideration" of the problem of refugee Jewish physicians was asked by the Journal of the American Medical Association in an editorial which warned of the "difficulties arising from economic stress" and chauvinistic prejudices.

"The problem is increasing," the editorial said, pointing to the following increases in immigration of physicians: For 1937 — Austria 3, Germany 22, and Italy 11; for eight months of 1938 — Austria 62, Germany 302, and Italy 26.

Court Blocks Grab Of Jewish Property


PRAGUE. — Czechoslovakian branches of Austrian firms formerly owned by Jews were put beyond the reach of the Austrian Nazi authorities when the Czechoslovakian supreme court ruled that private property in Czechoslovakia was inviolate and that no person could be deprived of it.

The decision was made in a case growing out of the demand of the Austrian authorities for the right to place an Austrian commissar in charge of Czechoslovakian branches of what used to be an Austrian Jewish company.

Nazis Forbid Jews To Deal in Stamps

BERLIN. — The anti-Semitic campaign extended to stamp collectors and dealers when a Jewish stamp merchant who had been operating for 30 years, was ordered out of business. Inasmuch as postage stamps are classed as negotiable paper, traffic in them is henceforth closed to Jews, the order specified.

Toscanini in "Dutch" with Mussolini

It is reported however, that Toscanini was able to escape, and is now on his way to America to conduct a series of concerts for the New York Philharmonic.

It was deemed expedient to change the workers meeting which was scheduled to be held October 6 to Thursday evening, October 13. The meeting will be held at the Biltmore Hotel. Special notices are being mailed to the workers to that effect.

HOLIDAY MESSAGES

During the high holidays all congregation presidents and rabbis were asked to make special

pleas during synagogue services for greater support to the Providence Community Fund which contributes to five Jewish agencies. Meanwhile Mr. Temkin is recruiting division chairmen and workers to help him in the big task of covering several hundred prospects.

Mr. Temkin expressed a hope that in the present emergency the Providence Community Fund will not be forgotten because the work of all the 40 agencies becomes more important than ever viewed from a long range program planning.

BUILDINGS DAMAGED

There have been damages to a number of buildings owned by Community Fund agencies and many of the agencies will be called upon for the task of rehabilitation after the first emergency is over.

Claim Refugees Are Not Public Charges Relatives Assume All Responsibility

NEW YORK. — Not a single German refugee admitted to the United States has become a public charge, Dr. Joseph P. Chamberlain, chairman of the National Coordinating Committee for Aid to Refugees and emigrants Coming from Germany, declared at a press conference here.

"By for the greater number of immigrants from Germany to the United States in the past four years have come to relatives who have furnished affidavits and assumed responsibility for them after their arrival, and carried that responsibility out so that the immigrants have been absorbed into the life of the country through the efforts of their relatives and friends," he said.

Report Zionist Revolt Plot in Soviet Union

LONDON. — An alleged "counter-revolutionary Zionist organization" with headquarters in Moscow's Great Synagogue, is reported to have been uncovered by the OGPU, Soviet secret police, according to a dispatch to the London Daily Telegraph. The leader of the alleged organization, the Telegraph says, was Rabbi Medalie.

The plotters are accused of sabotage, charging extortionate prices for matzoth and attempting to undermine the Jewish colonization work in Biro Bidjan, the Ukraine and Crimea.

WARSAW. — Advices from Danzig report that an American rabbi named Chaimson was wounded during street attacks against Jews by uniformed Nazi youths in celebration of the Nazi Party Congress at Nuremberg. Among others injured was a Lodz merchant named Rosengart, who was

Council to Aid Jews In Eastern Europe

Delegates Meet For First Time

NEW YORK. — The "General Council" formed in recent months by the American Jewish Committee, the American Jewish Congress, the B'nai B'rith, and the Jewish Labor Committee, to coordinate activities for the protection of Jews met this week, considered the conditions in which Jewish communities in many parts of the world find themselves and determined to undertake a program designed to meet this situation and immediate activities to deal with the most recent developments affecting Jewish life in Czechoslovakia and Italy.

The meeting brought together for the first time the permanent representatives of the member groups, five from each organization, who have been elected to the "General Council" for a period of one year.

After careful consideration the "General Council" named a special committee to study the Jewish situation, examine the methods hitherto employed, and on the basis of these studies, to recommend a program to be carried out by it. This committee, to be known as the Policy and Program Committee, consists of two representatives from each of the four organizations under the chairmanship of Arthur S. Meyer.

Brown Prof. Heads Temple College Dept.

Charles A. Backman, Chairman of the School Board of Temple Emanu-El, has announced that Prof. Israel J. Kapstein of Brown University will be in charge of the College Department, which opens on Sunday morning, at 11:30 o'clock. The course to be offered is "The Making of the Modern Jew," and is open to all college men and women of the Congregation and community.

The High School Department also opens on Sunday and will have its first session at 11 o'clock, with Samuel Kessler as instructor.

All other classes in the Religious School will similarly be in full session on Sunday morning.

Hooked-Nose 'Aryan' Says Noted Scientist

LONDON. — The convex or hooked nose, popularly but erroneously regarded as a "Jewish nose," is as much Aryan as it is Jewish, Dr. Henry Field of the Field Museum of Natural History in Chicago this week told the congress of the British Association for the Advancement of Science.

He made this assertion on the strength of exhaustive anthropological researches in Persia, the traditional home of the so-called "Aryans."

His studies show, Dr. Field said, that "perhaps the original source of diffusion of the prominent hook-nosed group scattered among many racial stocks" is Persia.

His investigation also gave another scientific setback to the myth that "Aryans" are always tall, blue-eyed, long-headed

TO OUR CUSTOMERS

Two weeks have elapsed since the disastrous hurricane and flood of September 21st. In this time the Narragansett Electric Company has succeeded in repairing its high-tension interconnections and in restoring its flooded power plants to service. It has reestablished service to urban centers, particularly in downtown Providence, and rapid progress is being made in restoring service in outlying areas. Service has already been restored to all hospitals and to practically every public building, refrigerating plant and food depot on our lines. Particular efforts have been made to take care of Doctors' offices and houses known to shelter cases of serious illness.

The Narragansett Electric Company has its complete personnel organized on a 24-hour basis with every available employee assigned to some work in connection with reestablishing service. Emergency workers have been employed and brought in from affiliated and other companies to help us. The task confronting us requires trained men, men familiar with the highly specialized work of climbing poles and handling electric wires. Obviously, it has been impossible to use untrained men for this type of work. To do so would have been dangerous to life and property and would have delayed rehabilitation work.

The New England Power System has transported line crews and trained electrical workers from many sources - in some cases crews have flown in by air and line trucks have come over the road from as far as Georgia, Pennsylvania, Ohio and Michigan. These trained utility crews have worked with the company's own line crews and maintenance forces, together with any available trained men who could be obtained locally, in a continuous effort to restore service.

We recognize the inconvenience and feelings of those customers without electrical service while their neighbor's lights are burning. This situation is due, in most instances, to damaged wires between poles and houses, or to scattered spots where repairs have not been completed. While a relatively short time would be required to restore service to any individual home, or to make local repairs, the greatest progress can be made by systematic orderly procedure, not hindered by the unproductive time spent in moving men from their daily scheduled work. We earnestly hope that our customers who are still without service will cooperate with us in maintaining this procedure.

Additions are being made to the overhead line forces as rapidly as trained men or crews can be obtained, and no slacking of effort or of overtime work is contemplated until full service has been restored.

The Narragansett Electric Company is extremely grateful to its customers for their cooperation and patience during this emergency and again wishes to extend its appreciation to local and state authorities for the splendid part they have played in facilitating the work of rehabilitation.

Kuhn and Dickstein Debate

Audience Amuses Self With Heckling

Kuhn Denies Aid From Germany

NEW YORK. — Fritz Kuhn, der fuhrer of the German-American Bund, and Representative Samuel Dickstein, investigator of Nazi activities debated in Caravan Hall at 110 East Fifty-ninth Street, last Saturday whether the Bund is American. Today the question they debated was still unsettled; probably nobody's mind was changed by anything said at the meeting.

Thirty Policemen on Hand

About thirty policemen were stationed in the hall when the meeting opened and the debaters started out with fire in their eyes. Kuhn, it was said, had sent Dickstein a telegram in advance of the meeting wishing him a Happy New Year.

Bundsmen applauded furiously as Kuhn referred to Dickstein as a "yellow Communist," a funny guy" and as just plain "Sammy." There was booing and heckling when the Congressman spoke.

"For four years this Dickstein has attacked us in Congress and has even been yellow enough to attack us outside Congress," Kuhn said. He declared that if Dickstein could prove the Bund gets money from Germany he would shake hands with him "and everybody knowing what I think of him—that's a big statement," he added.

"You and Hitler are both yellow bellies, drafting an army in this country to send back to Germany and fight," Dickstein retorted.

Offers to Punch Nose

Although Kuhn said the Bund is 100 per cent American, the Congressman declared it is "200 per cent un-American." At a shout of "Liar!" from the floor, Dickstein offered to step down and punch a heckler in the nose.

Bund Plans Model Village on Camp Site To Sell Lots to Members only

HARTFORD, Conn. — Unable to use its 178-acre tract in Southbury for a camp because of a zoning law passed by local residents to keep the Nazis out, the management in a statement decided to parcel up the property and sell it in individual lots to Bund members for the erection of a "model community."

Duncan C. Folger, Bund district leader, revealed this new manoeuvre in a statement declaring that "a number of innovations in municipal government will be tried out, together with certain economic ideas which have been suggested by several large industrialists. Everything will of course be carried out in accordance with local ordinances."

Swartz Rejects Request of Rothschild to Alter Play

Maurice Schwartz has always regarded the Rothschilds as half-legendary characters—possibility for the purpose of portraying some future play. Imagine his amazement, when, after a performance in Paris, several months ago, he was informed of Baron Rothschild's presence in his suite. What a visitor! And what a visit.

It was a showing of the Yiddish success, "The Brothers Ashkenazi," and Mr. Schwartz was receiving the plaudits of the public as well as the press. Mr. Rothschild's presence would surely add the right touch to the celebration.

But—no pleasant exchange of sentiment followed. Not even a toast or "bonjour." Instead, sparks began to fly. Sparks evoked by caustic charges. "The Jews—Jews—Jews!" cried the Baron, "always the Jews! Have we not enough to bear already? Must you aggravate the situation by flaunting the 'Internationale' in your production?"

Momentarily taken aback, but not in the least disturbed, Mr. Schwartz soon rallied and struck back with characteristic vigor. The play was a work of art; the theme true to life. Who was Rothschild to impose restrictions, act as censor, distort history? That and much more followed. In the end the Baron retreated without getting the annoying tune replaced by the "Marsellaise" or "any other number." And Mr. Schwartz remained true to his creation.

Smiling sardonically as he recounted this experience the other day, Mr. Schwartz continued with much more saddened dissertation on the plight of Jewry throughout the world. It is not only because his work is integrally tied with Jewish life and problems. It is because Mr. Schwartz is as

keen an observer of world affairs as he is a student of the theatre. And it is in moments like these that his emotions tear themselves free from histrionic bounds, when he becomes a challenging dynamo, proud of the brave young pioneers of Palestine and thankful for what he feels is the final awakening of a long-maligned people.

Refugees Housed in Old Swiss Factory

BERNE. — The flood of Jewish refugees from Austria and Germany, which two weeks ago reached a daily average of 140, all of whom entered illegally, was halted temporarily this week by erection of a barbed wire fence along the frontier points, the Journal de Geneve reports.

The 2,000 refugees who crossed the frontier previously are now housed in an abandoned textile factory in Diepoldsau over which they have erected a big sign saying, "thanks to the Swiss people."

Motorist Plows Into Worshippers

Three unidentified young men narrowly escaped severe beatings by a crowd of enraged worshippers last Wednesday night, when they were halted after plowing with their car into the overflow of people that was leaving the South Providence Hebrew Congregation after Yom Kippur services. The driver had driven so close to the curb that those standing on the sidewalk and in the gutter had to leap to avoid being struck . . .

After demanding the names of the driver and his companions (which were refused) members of the group that encircled the car, threatened to teach them a lesson for their reckless driving, which nearly resulted in tragedy.

Saner heads prevailed, however, and after the license number had been noted, the men were permitted to drive off with the advice to "Take it easy," and that their conduct would be reported to the Division of Motor Vehicles.

Entire Arab Town Ordered Vacated

JERUSALEM. — All of the 2,700 inhabitants of the Arab town of Jenin were ordered this week to vacate by military authorities. The move followed the assassination of Assistant District Commissioner Walter S. Moffat, who died in a Haifa hospital after being shot by an Arab hunchback who broke into the Jenin police station.

The slayer was shot and killed during an attempt to escape from a military camp where he had been interned. A 22-hour curfew allowing residents to appear on the streets for only two hours of the day, has been established in Jenin.

Legion Asks 10-year Ban on Immigration

LOS ANGELES.— The American Legion's twentieth national convention asked the closing of all immigration quotas for ten years. The convention approved in full the report of its National Americanism Committee favoring a reduction of at least 90 per cent in immigration quotas and opposing any kind of asylum bill which would make the United States a "dumping ground" for political, class and racial refugees.

Kansas Politicians Assails Racial Issue

Condemn Attack On Candidate

TOPEKA, Kansas. — An anti-Semitic campaign waged against Payne H. Ratner, Republican candidate for governor, on the ground his father is Jewish has brought a storm of denunciation from both political parties and the Democratic offer of a \$100 reward for the arrest of persons distributing anti-Jewish leaflets aimed at Mr. Ratner.

The reward was posted by the Democratic State Committee with the approval of Governor Walter Huxman, Mr. Ratner's opponent, after it had been suggested by William Allen White, Republican leader and publisher of the Emporia Gazette, who editorially hailed Governor Huxman's "stinging rebuke to the Ku Kluxers and Jew-baiters who peddled these circulars."



It Can Happen Here

A number of stores throughout the city are displaying cards containing scenes of the recent hurricane and flood, with the caption "It Can't Happen Here." . . . This recalls a similar composite picture, which appeared in the local daily some weeks ago, of a boat on flooded Exchange Place . . . The heading on the composite picture also expressed skepticism as to the possibility of such an event in Rhode Island . . . Yet, with dramatic speed and suddenness, a hurricane and flood did descend on Rhode Island, and within the space of two hours left untold damage and tragedy . . . It DID happen here, despite all previous records of storms . . .

In comparison, we have another evil, which skeptics have also claimed "can't happen here,—the increasing growth of Fascism at the expense of Democracy . . . Because of the apathy towards this growing cancer, it is possible that in the future the winds of Fascism will do more human damage than the big wind storm of September 21st.

"Democracy by its very nature," according to Dorothy Thompson in a recent article, entertains the Fascist invaders, unless it can pin upon them the charge of spy or high treason . . . This charge is one made according to Democratic interpretation . . . For the invaders invariably attach themselves to already existing societies inside the democratic countries, with the object of exacerbating already existing disunities and hostilities . . . This process can go so far, that before the bulk of the people are aware of it, Democracy can come under the rule of a Fascist regime." . . .

Government agencies are now considering methods by which the trend of hurricane and similar storms can be watched, so that sections of the country, long believed immune, may be notified in advance of the storm . . . And, similarly, the government should create agencies to watch the growing pains of Fascism, for if Fascism does sweep the country there will be little opportunity to remedy the accomplished fact.

Awarded Membership In Italian Society

NEW YORK. — In what was obviously intended to be a gesture of proof that Italian-Americans do not approve of Italy's anti-Jewish policy, the Federation of Apulian Associations of America, a federation of Italian Societies, presented Governor Herbert H. Lehman with a life membership scroll in the National United Italian Association for his "service to the people of the Italian race in America" after hearing him warn that America would tolerate neither Fascism nor anti-Semitism. The presentation was made by Generoso Pope, publisher of Italian newspapers.

Mushroom Temple Suspends Business

NEW YORK. — Ticket-selling for a Washington Heights "mushroom" synagogue's High Holy day services was halted when Magistrate Bernard Mogilesky released two Jews accused of selling tickets after they promised to sell no more and to refund the money already collected.

The two men, Isadore Blutter and Samuel Dick, were arrested on the complaint of Sam Paperle, president of the Inwood Hebrew Congregation, who acted under the law which forbids the sale of tickets for religious services purporting to be in accordance with the precepts of any recognized faith, save by representatives of a religious association or corporation. The defendants had no authorization to act for any synagogue.

Pamphlet by Priest Denounces Racialism

ST. LOUIS. — A pamphlet by a Catholic priest which refutes false charges against the Jews and calls upon people of all faiths to fight extreme nationalism, this week was rapidly becoming the best-selling pamphlet of the year.

The pamphlet is entitled, "Why Are Jews Persecuted?" and its author is Father Joseph N. Moody, professor of Medieval and Modern European History at Cathedral College, New York City.

Over 40,000 copies have been sold in three months since publication. Protestant, Catholic and Jewish organizations have aided in its distribution.

Mme. Harand Noted Hate Fighter, Here Movement Has 30,000 Members

NEW YORK. — In exile from her native Austria with a price set on her head by the German Government, Mme. Irene Harand, Catholic founder of the World Movement against Racial Hatred and Distress, arrived here last week to establish the headquarters of her organization and to make permanent residence.

Mme. Harand, the daughter of a well-to-do Viennese family, happened to be lecturing in England last March when Hitler accomplished the Austro-German Anschluss. She continued her activities in Europe, selling her jewels to meet organization expenses. She was met on her arrival on the liner Paris by representatives of anti-Nazi and refugee organizations.

Her movement which was launched in Vienna in 1930, has attracted thousands of supporters in many countries. At the time of Anschluss it had 30,000 members in Vienna and vicinity. Her newspaper, Gerechtigkeits (Justice) which is published in Czechoslovakia, France and Sweden, has subscribers in 38 countries. Mme. Harand visited the United States a year ago.

Born in Poland, he was brought up and spent the greater part of his life in New York. After a course of training at the Earlton (N. Y.) Chalutz Training Farm, he came to Eretz Israel in 1932 with the other American members of his Kibbutz. For five years they were temporarily settled at Hadera, working as laborers in the plantations and at other types of work. In 1937 the Keren Kayemeth, by allocating to them the Juara tract enabled them to found a settlement that had been their dream for so long.

Children of Bund Members Taught Religious Prejudice

NEW YORK. — Children attending the camps of the German-American Bund are being taught how to foment racial and religious prejudice in the public schools by raising questions of race and creed, a sub-committee of the Dies Committee Investigating Un-American Activities, was told by Roy P. Monahan, former New York State commander of the Disabled American Veterans.

Monahan quoted Theodor Dinkelacker, national youth leader of the Bund, as saying "our youth are destined to carry forth our Nazi ideals" and "anyone of German blood who would denounce his German fatherland after becoming an American citizen would be a despicable scoundrel."

Monahan also charged that Nazi groups in this country, headed by Bund leader Fritz Kuhn, whom he described as "a potential Konrad Henlein", are engaged in a widespread effort at espionage and

subversive activities.

Monahan accused Kuhn of being one of the participants in Hitler's Munich beer hall putsch in 1923.

The veteran's leader also asserted that a unit of the Gestapo, Nazi secret police, is functioning in the United States under the guise of a clipping and press service. Called Bunaste, the unit is headed by Otto Wegener.

Unit Plans Assistance For Tuberculars


