Evian Refugee Compromise Reached

More Troops Sent in Palestine Riots

Fear Martial Law May Be Imposed

300 Casualties In Undeclared War

JERUSALEM.—The first battalion of the Essex-Regiment was expected here to reinforce other British troops trying to stamp out Jewish-Arab violence. In a week nearly 100 have been killed and 200 wounded.

The troops were arriving as the unofficial war between Jews and Arabs reached its highest pitch since Solomon ben Joseph, Jewish Zion revisionist, was executed for bomb throwing.

The authorities yesterday counted more than twelve killings and scores of injured. Some of those wounded were in critical condition.

A 10 P. M. curfew imposed in Nazareth, Christ's birthplace, because a bomb had been thrown at Jewish busses. A similar curfew was imposed at Tulkaram after the killing of an Arab and also at Safed and Acre because of shopkeeper's threats to strike.

Bombs were thrown into three busses filled with Jews. The driver of one bus killed the assailant. A second bomb killed two Jewish passengers and wounded twelve, four seriously. The third bomb injured two Jews.

Anti-Semites Active In Nation's Capitol

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Anti-Semitic literature was publicity distributed within sight of the nation's capitol for the first time when copies of a leaflet sponsored by the "Nationalist Publishing Co." were handed out in Colonial Villiage, Va., a Washington suburb.

The leaflet said: "Communism is Jewish. The U. S. Government is controlled by Jews. The press, radio and theatre are Jew-owned and controlled. They have a secret, inner world government known to few people. Communists are 90 per cent for Roosevelt. Why? Get proof by sending either cash or money order to: Nationalist Publishing Co." The address is a Washington post office box.

Nazis Abandon Plan To Mark Stores

BERLIN.—Fearing an economic crisis if it goes through with its announced plan of forcing all Jews out of business by compelling every Jewish establishment to display a special marker identifying it as such, the German ministry of economics is reported to have dropped for the time being its plan for an officially regulated anti-Jewish boycott.

It is reported that instead of enforcing this decree the government intends to eliminate Jews from business by speeding up the existing process of Aryanization without resorting to forced sales which would create a panic and

Seeking Jewels Nazis X-Ray Fleeing Doctor

NEW YORK.—The troubled state of European affairs was reflected today when the liner Aquitania docked.

One passenger was Dr. Zena O. Joann, an Alabama-born heart specialist who lives at 1,170 Fifth Ave., and is both a striking beauty and an altruist. Dr. Joann studied in Vienna for several years, and she has been working for nine months helping Jewish medical men to flee Vienna.

Dr. Joann developed a popular reducing cream and is using part of her earnings from its sale in evacuating the non-Aryan doctors from Austria.

One doctor, she said, was X-rayed by government officers before he was permitted to cross the border, a report having been circulated that he had swallowed some of his jewels with the intention of getting them out of the country. The X-ray showed the report false.

Deprive U. S. Jews of Polish Citizenship

WARSAW.—The Polish government deprived fifty-eight persons, most of them Jews, of Polish citizenship today under the first application of a disenfranchisement law adopted March 23.

The list in the official gazette named three United States residents:—David Silberstein, of Washington, and Mayer Balzman and Jacob Klenha, of New York. Four others live in Buenos Aires, twenty-three in Palestine, seven in Belgium and four in Austria. Another list is expected in a fortnight.

ANTI-SEMITES ELECTED

PARIS.—Andre Maurras, one of France's most outspoken anti-Semites and reactionaries, was elected to the French Academy when he won the seat vacant since 1936 when Henri Robert died. Maurras is the leader of Action Francaise, royalist and semi-Fascist organization.

Hadassah Women to Get Course in Jewish Problems

NEW YORK.—An experimental adult education course in modern Jewish problems will be inaugurated this fall when Hadassah, the Women's Zionist organization of America releases its 1938-9 study program to 68,000 members in 45 states throughout the country, it was announced today at the National headquarters of the organization in this city.

The course grew out of a demand among Hadassah's 375 chapters for information on present political, social and economic conditions and their bearing on Jewish life. Mrs. Emanuel Halpern, executive director of the Hadassah

Anti-Fascist Demonstrators Routed by Riot Squads

TORONTO.—Police riot squads this week routed an anti-Fascist demonstration, arresting four and frustrating a march on Massey Hall, where 2,500 Fascists were meeting. Five thousand attended the counter meeting sponsored by the League for Peace and Democracy.

The J. T. A. representative, attending the Fascist meeting, was roughly handled by Fascists who recognized him as a Jew and ejected him. Joseph Farr, national organizer of the Fascists, launched a tirade of abuse against the Jews. At the height of the attack a woman in the gallery, screamed a protest but her words could not be heard plainly in the uproar that followed. Storm troopers, clad in blue shirts with swastika

arm bands, pulled the woman from her seat and ejected her.

Farr resumed his address but had not proceeded more than a few minutes when another woman in the gallery burst out with heated denunciations of his criticism of Jews. She was treated in similar fashion and the meeting continued.

Dr. Otto Bauer, Austrian Exile, Dies

PARIS.—Dr. Otto Bauer, one of the leaders in the 1934 Austrian Socialist "revolt" and Foreign Minister in the first Socialist government of post-war Austria, died this week as an exile in his Paris home.

Dr. Bauer, 57, represented Austria at the World War Peace Conference and served on the Austrian National Council until 1934, when the late Chancellor Dollfuss exiled him and deprived him of his citizenship, with many other Socialists. The exile followed the bloody conflict of 1934, when the Dollfuss regime bombarded Socialist apartments in Vienna.

MUST PAY TO SHOOT

ANDOVER, N. J.—Striking out at the German American Bund's Camp Nordland located in this north New Jersey town, the local township council passed an ordinance placing a license fee of \$500 on shooting galleries. The only such gallery in town is at Camp Nordland.

Group to Function By End of Month

List Proposals For Assistance

EVIAN, France.—A compromise among the United States, Great Britain and France cleared the way for an international refugee organization. It probably will start functioning in London at the end of the month.

The compromise was reached after the United States delegation, headed by Myron C. Taylor, dropped its demands that the organization be empowered to aid political refugees of all nationalities. Britain and France wanted it to help refugees of greater Germany. The three Powers finally agreed that the organization should settle the question itself once it has been established.

The agreement was embodied in a resolution which will be sent to Washington, London and Paris and the Governments of the other Powers represented at the conference here for approval.

Proposals for Assistance When the resolution is submitted to the conference by the end of this week, it was expected to include these points.

Rabbis Advocate Five-Day Week

BELMAR, N. J.—The National Convention of the Rabbinical Council of America has adopted a resolution advocating the five-day week as "an ideal solution of the Jewish Sabbath problem." The organization also wired the New York Constitutional Convention asking for enactment of a measure exempting Jews from observing Sunday, and urging that public employees receive the benefit of the five-day week. The council also urged employers to permit Jewish employees to observe the Sabbath on Saturday.

Rabbi Herbert S. Goldstein, of New York, who was re-elected president of the council, praised "the co-operation of the Catholic Church through the message of the Pope to all Christians that anti-Semitism is anti-Christian."

Rare Jewish Books Finding Home Here

NEW YORK.—Many rare Jewish books and manuscripts owned by Germans and Austrian Jews are finding their way to America and especially to the library of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, it was disclosed last week by Dr. Alexander Marx, librarian.

Some of the old Jewish volumes have been taken to Palestine by refugees, he said, but most of them are coming here for fear of what might happen to them at the hands of Arab rioters in the Holy Land. Many more rare old Jewish literary items might come here but for the fact that the Nazis refuse to allow their owners to sell them without turning over the proceeds to the government, it was learned from another

Arab Terrorists Utilize Hashish to Stiffen Attacks

JERUSALEM.— Authorities in this country are being presented with a problem almost as serious as the Arab-Jew disturbances. Nearly all terrorists captured by the police and troops have been found to be under the influence of the drug, hashish, and the increased smuggling of the drug into the country is causing no end of worry to officials.

Men of the East have used hashish for centuries. The word "assassin" is derived from its name. And today, according to authorities, the Arab bands swallow large doses before they go out to ambush and kill in the hills around Jerusalem. The drug produces a sense of extreme courage and aggressiveness.

But there is another reason why the bandits go to extraordinary lengths to get the drug. It seems it also produces an aphrodisiac effect. One of the chief prison officials in Palestine told the story how Sheik Farhan, leader of the terrorist bands in Northern Palestine, obtained the drug while in acre jail awaiting execution.

His four wives came to kiss

him farewell. All of them kissed him on the mouth. Now, the warden knew that it was not the custom for an Arab to kiss wives in public under any circumstances, and that in any case an Arab usually kisses a woman on the cheek. His suspicious aroused, he investigated and found that each of the wives had transferred a dose of hashish from her mouth to the Sheik's.

Today the terrorists follow almost the same semi-religious ritual of the mysterious Order of Assassins formed originally in the eleventh century to fight the Crusades. Young girls were drugged and taken to a luxurious harem filled with beautiful houris. They were told they were in "paradise," but after several days testing its delights, they were drugged again and taken back into ordinary life. They then were told in order to get back again they must commit a holy killing, then kill themselves and they would return to paradise. The word "hashasheen" was derived from this practice, and later corrupted into assassin. Today, when an act of terrorism is to be committed, the sheik summons the band and lots are drawn to select those who are to carry it out. A special religious ritual is conducted, during which the sheik exhorts the chosen group on the bliss that awaits the true Moslem warrior in Paradise. Doses of hashish are distributed and out they go to pillage, plunder and murder.

Poland Establishes Refugee Prison Camp

WARSAW.—In a move generally regarded as aimed primarily at curbing the influx of Jewish refugees from Germany and Austria, the Polish government officially announced that all foreigners entering the country illegally or overstaying the time allotted them in their visas will be imprisoned in concentration camps.

"The entry of such persons into Poland has to be regarded as harmful from the viewpoint of the state," the government's announcement said. "The minister of interior, therefore, has decided to send these undesirable persons to the isolation camp at Kartuz-Bereza. Action in this respect has already started."

7,126 Vienna Jews Dropped by Bar

VIENNA.—The official Nazi organ, Voelkischer Beobachter, published the names today of 7,126 Vienna Jews "temporarily removed from the list of practicing lawyers."

Permission was granted for 1,050 Jewish war veterans to continue their law practices.

Reich Must Keep Lithuanian Rabbis

KAUNAS.—The German Government cancelled scheduled deportation of several Lithuanian rabbis from the Reich after the Lithuanian Government threatened to deport German citizens from Lithuania as a reprisal, it was revealed.

In addition the Lithuanian Government is demanding that Lithuanian Jews be allowed to take out their property in emigrating from the Reich, otherwise the property of German citizens in Lithuania will be expropriated.

The Lithuanian minister to Berlin has received assurances that Lithuanian Jews will be treated the same as British and American Jews in regard to application of Goering's property registration decree.

Indiana U. to Have Hillel Foundation

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Dr. H. B. Wells, president of Indiana University, has extended a cordial welcome to the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation soon to be established at Bloomington, it was announced by Dr. A. L. Sachar, national director of the Foundations.

The Indiana Foundation, which will be the twelfth in the United States, will be established on the campus of Indiana University in September. A director will soon be appointed.

Jewish Business Limited in Budapest

BUDAPEST.—The Government today began execution of the new law limiting Jewish participation in Hungarian economy to 20 per cent issuing a decree calling for submission of data by professional and business enterprises.

All members of lawyers', physician's and engineers' chambers are notified to submit personal information by July 20 to the chambers to compile lists of the members for submission to the Government. Only 5 per cent of Jews will be allowed among new candidates to these chambers so long as the percentage of Jews in the chambers is higher than 20 per cent. The second part of the decree obliges private enterprises, except those with exclusively religious aims, to notify the Government of the number of their employees, the religion of the employees and their salaries, as a step to carrying out the proportionate restriction.

Witness Sees Hitler Party

RIVERHEAD, L. I.—A witness in the trial of six directors of the German-American Settlement League was on record here as predicting that the German Nazi salute would replace the American form of saluting the flag.

Martin E. Wunderlich, of 403 W. 115th St., New York City, a probationary member of the bund, in taking the stand was asked to salute the flag.

He raised his right arm in the stiff-armed Nazi salute.

"Is that the American salute?" Assistant District Attorney Lindsay R. Henry asked.

"No, but it will be," Wunderlich replied.


Predicts Party Like Hitler's

Anti-Nazis Launch National Campaign



NEW YORK CITY.—A national campaign against Nazi principles was launched spectacularly here July 4, by the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League. He denied the league was an oath-bound organization, contradicting the testimony of Willy Brandt, German-born former Nazi Storm Trooper, who previously had told of joining the bund and being required to take an oath pledging allegiance to Hitler.

Paderewski Party Seeks Jewish Curb

WARSAW.—The Polish labor party, recently founded by Ignace Paderewski and headed by General Josef Haller, this week adopted a resolution demanding "diplomatic, social and administrative action to eliminate Jewish influence" in Poland. The resolution demands transfer of economic positions from Jews to Poles and organization of planned mass emigration of Jews with the help of the government. It rejects violence and racialism, declaring Jews who have proved their attachment to Poland should enjoy full citizenship rights.

Nazi Advise Jews to Settle In Some Uncolonized Region

BERLIN.—An editorial in the Voekischer Beobachter, official newspaper of the Nazi party, asserted today that the solution of the Jewish refugee problem lay in settlement of Jews in some region not yet colonized by Europeans.

Discussing the refugee conference at Evain, France, and the current disturbances in Palestine, the newspaper said:—

"The German people are determined to carry this question to the only logical solution and prevent a return to conditions which the false tolerance and weakness of earlier generations made possible."

Palestine offered no prospect of a final solution of the Jewish problem, it was said, and other states

were not ready to receive Jews.

"There remains still another possibility namely the Soviet Union," said the editorial. "But the Jewish state (Russia) sent no representatives to the Evian conference. Why did not Lazarus Kaganovitch send Litvinov-Finkelstein?"

(Lazarus Kaganovitch, Russian Commissar of Heavy Industry and Land transport, a Jew, is regarded by many as the right hand man of Josef Stalin, Maxim Litvinov, Commissar for Foreign Affairs, adopted his name as a revolutionary alias, as did so many Russian leaders in Czarist days. His family name is given in some reference books as Wallach or Vallach, in others as Finkelstein.)

Form New Jewish Book Enterprise

NEW YORK.—Organization of a new Jewish book publishing enterprise to be known as The Vineyard Press for the purpose of issuing a series of Jewish books in English covering the entire range of Jewish history, poetry, fiction, philosophy, religion and tradition and to produce and circulate in beautiful English versions some of the outstanding achievements of the Neo-Hebrew novelists who have arisen in contemporary Palestine has been announced here.

The Vineyard Press is organized on a membership basis, with subscribers entitled to six books a year. The editorial board includes Ludwig Lewisohn, Rabbi Solomon Goldman, Elias Newman, Asher Barash, Simon Halkin, Charles Cowen and Mordecai Newman.

Arabs on Strike In North Palestine

JERUSALEM.—An Arab general strike tied up the northern districts of Palestine. Authorities, fearful of a repetition of the bloody, six months' general strike in 1936, imposed a 10 P. M. curfew.

Casualties in rioting at Tel Aviv and Jaffa, where Jews and Arabs fought yesterday with knives and guns, rose to four dead and nine wounded.

Minority Oppression Impossible in U. S.

Solicitor-General Assumes Minorities

NEW YORK.—Assurance of minority protection in America lies chiefly, in the peculiar composition of American society itself, Robert H. Jackson, solicitor-general of the United States, said in accepting a monument presented to the American people by the Republic of Finland.

Declaring that American political institutions are based on a mosaic of minorities in which none is sufficiently dominant to threaten the liberties of any other, Mr. Jackson said "we are a nation with no permanently preponderant group in religion, in nationality, in tradition, in interest or in opinion. And these men of many origins are united in a firm confidence and a stubborn determination that this land will not tolerate oppression of any racial, national, religious or political minority."

Times Haven't Changed

During the years of the Roman Empire there existed, in Alexandria, an organization known as "The White Shoes" whose essential purpose was to harry the Jews and to promote anti-Semitism. The name was tagged to the group because of their penchant for white sandals.

In these days, Jew baiters identify themselves in a similar manner employing colored shirts. We have the brown, green, black, gray, silver and many other hues all signifying one purpose—the furthering of authoritarian principles. The colors may have changed during the years but the purposes have remained the same.

Idiot's Delight

Before the week is over concluded more than 20,000 people of Rhode Island will have seen Robert S. Sherwood's Pulitzer prize play, "Idiot's Delight" which is being presented at the Albee Theatre. Mr. Sherwood's condemnation of war and the evils of totalitarian tyranny — many truthfully termed it propaganda — will do more to expose the villainies of these regimes than the mouthing of sincere speakers.

Mr. Sherwood successfully appeals to the mind and the emotions. And those who were fortunate enough to view the performance left the theatre with sharply etched impressions that will not be forgotten soon.

While only passing reference was made to the plight of Jews in Nazi Germany, incidents of the play, made it impossible for the audience to ignore that it was not only war that was "Idiot's Delight."

David vs Goliath

Whatever the outcome of Czechoslovakia's heroic struggle to resist partition in fact or in name, it now appears that the Jews in the Sudeten (Nazi) areas of the country are doomed.

If the new nationality statute should grant the Sudetens autonomy in all but national defense and foreign affairs, the 22,000 Jews in the Sudeten districts will be compelled to migrate or suffer discrimination, degradation and denial of equal rights.

The proposed statute is expected to oblige the Sudetens to recognize the equal rights of non-Nazi minorities in their area. But it is safe to assume that these rights will be observed largely in the breach. That means that the Bohemian Jews will have to move, bag and baggage, to other Czechoslovak provinces.

Seemingly that should present but minor difficulties but the fact is that all reactionary forces in Czechoslovakia are exploiting the present crisis for their own purposes.

Remarque Deprived of Nazi Citizenship

Books Vilified By Militarists

BERLIN.—Erich Maria Remarque author of "All Quiet on the Western Front," was deprived of his German citizenship along with sixty-eight other persons, most of them were Jews.

Hated by Militarists

Remarque was the object of bitter hatred on the part of German militarists when Adolf Hitler was still regarded in his own country as just a minor but noisy nuisance.

"All Quiet on the Western Front" was a best seller throughout the world, and thousands of readers though it worthy of the Nobel prize. That aroused Junkers to a campaign of vilification. They said Remarque was sixty-five years old, never was in the army, is a French Jew, author of a book on mixing cocktails and one on experiences in brothels.

All those statements are incorrect. He is a native of Westphalia, a descendant of French emigres who went to Rhineland during the French Revolution. He is a Roman Catholic and was born in 1899.

Attorney's Father Dies in Bethlehem

Word has been received here of the death of Richard Hendel, 60, prominent New York and New London business man and father of Maurice W. Hendel, Providence attorney.

Mr. Hendel died at his summer home in Bethlehem, N. H., and funeral services were held in New London. Born in Lithuania, he came to Westery at the turn of the century, but later went into the department store business in Holyoke, Mass., and hence to New London, where he was founder and president of the R. & J. Underwear Co., of New London and New York. He was also a former president of the E. W. Sutton Carpet Lining Corp., of New York.

Mr. Hendel was affiliated with various civic and fraternal organizations in New London and New York.

Besides his son, he is survived by his wife and three daughters, Mrs. Sadie Somach of Brooklyn, Mrs. Sylvia Itzkowitz and Mrs. Marion Aronson, both of New London.



Hundreds of Jews Stranded in Greece

ATHENS.—A scandal of major proportions involving several hundred Jews from Austria who left that country in the belief that they had Chinese visas but were taken on a wild goose chase to Palestine where they were refused admittance was disclosed here when 150 of the disillusioned refugees reached the Greek port of Piraeus.

They had been taken to Palestine with the understanding that they would be smuggled into the country but they failed to get in and have been dumped into Greece to share the fate of 350 other Austrian refugees already stranded here under similar circumstances. Homeless and destitute, the unfortunate Jews have been allowed to stay temporarily in a warehouse but lack of sanitary conditions and funds makes their condition precarious.

Hat-Check-Girl Asks Marriage Annulment

NEW YORK.—Mrs. Millie Stern Abel, a hat-check girl in a New York night club, applied in Supreme Court for an annulment of her marriage to George Abel, a private chauffeur in Germany, who has obtained a German annulment from his wife on the ground that she is not "pure Aryan." Thomas C. T. Crain, official referee, reserved decision. Mrs. Abel is the daughter of a Protestant mother and a Jewish father.

RABBIS CONFER

ATLANTIC CITY.—Advocating a strengthened Synagogue Council of America which could unite Reform, Orthodox and Conservative Jews for the performance of the "solemn tasks" now confronting world Jewry, Rabbi Max C. Currick of Erie, Pa., president of the world's largest and most influential rabbinical body, opened the 49th annual meeting of the Central Conference of American Rabbis here.

Jersey City Row Halted by Truce

JERSEY CITY.—The committee appointed to arbitrate the differences between the Jersey City Jewish Community Center and Temple Emanu-El reported that the congregation would be permitted to remain in the Center until a final agreement had been reached by the committee. Under the original order the Center was to have been vacated June 30.

Under the tentative agreement, Rabbi Benjamin Plotkin of the Temple and those associated with the Center have pledged themselves not to discuss the controversy or make any reference to it publicly until the agreement is reached.

Maurois Elected To French Academy

PARIS.—The highest academic honor in France was conferred upon the world-famous Jewish writer Andre Maurois when he was elected to the French Academy to fill a seat made vacant by the death of Rene Doumic.

The seat now occupied by Maurois is numbered 26 and has had only nine occupants since 1634, indicative of the longevity of French scholars. Maurois, whose real name is Emile Herzog, was a textile manufacturer until he created a stir with his biography of the poet Shelley. Since then he has been recognized as one of France's greatest contemporary writers.

VIENNA.—The bulk of Austria's privately-owned electrical, steel and automobile industries passed into the Government's hands today to be incorporated in the new state-owned Hermann Goering Steel Works.

An official announcement disclosed that a majority of the stock of the companies became available to the Government through the merger June 18 of the three largest Austrian banks—the Merkurbank, Laenderbank and Zivnostenska—which now are under the domination of the state-owned Dresdner Bank.

Included in the transfer were the Steyr, Daimler and Puch automobile works, the Simmering railway car factory, Judenburg steel works and Vienna Pauker Works.

Commission Head Favors Partition Can See No Other Solution

JERUSALEM.—Sir John Woodhead, chairman of the Technical Commission on Partition, emphatically declared that his Commission could not consider any alternative to partition in defining the province of the new investigating body during testimony.

James Ashton, of Leeds, who identified himself as a leader of the organization called "World State Volunteers"—which, he said, has 200 members, declared that his organization was trying to create a world state, with a world police force wearing an international uniform, which would solve world problems in general and Palestine problems in particular. His evidence consisted mainly of propaganda for his organization.

Fight to be Mapped On Anti-Semitism

NEW YORK.—A method of dealing with anti-Semitism in the United States without "further publicizing anti-Semitic propaganda" was discussed by a group of representative Jews and non-Jews at a luncheon this week.

The idea for the luncheon grew out of opposition from many Jewish leaders to the magazine Jewish Crisis. According to the editors, "an earnest desire to present a fair analysis to liberal America was mistaken for a disguised effort to poison American opinion against Jews." The problem was discussed by churchmen of all creeds, prominent members of the press and leaders in the Jewish movement. Johan J. Smertenko, chairman of the propaganda and publicity committee of the non-sectarian anti-Nazi League to Champion Human Rights, acted as chairman.

committee be established in London, composed of the diplomatic representatives of the Powers represented here.

(2) Recommendations that the nations which can admit refugees apply immigration laws in a liberal manner so as to facilitate the entry of suitable refugees.

(3) The suggestion that immigration authorities should accept any suitable identification papers from refugees and not insist on formal passports.

Jewish Men's Clubs Begin Movements to Aid Refugees

NEW YORK.—A comprehensive program, under the auspices of the National Co-Ordinating Committee for German Refugees, set up by President Roosevelt, to help Jewish refugees find economic security and to provide for their assimilation in Jewish-American social, religious, and cultural life is being undertaken by the National Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs, composed of 156 groups throughout this country and Canada.

The problem of aiding Jewish refugees was recognized at the Federation's recent convention, held in New York, when it was made the principal project of the organization for the coming year. A committee, headed by Stanley Garten, New York, prepared the program, which was approved by the organization. "Our efforts will be greatly stimulated because of the Evian Conference, now meeting in France, "Mr. Garten stated.

The Federation will urge the

presidents of each Men's Club to appoint committees to act as the representatives of the National Co-Ordinating Committee in investigating the situation "regarding possibilities of employment or business for refugees in their locality." All further work will be done by the National Co-Ordinating Committee with the help of the local committees.

The National Co-Ordinating Committee will then apportion the refugees on the basis of the report and on the size of the Jewish population in the community where the refugees are to be sent. An attempt will be made to locate them outside of the urban centers.

The second part of the program, which the committee considers most important, will be "to encourage the refugees to become part of our community socially and spiritually, instead of forming a separate group or groups, within their own sphere."
