## German Consul Ignites Row Over 3 Jews in Manila Club

MANILA.—G. A. Sakowsky, German consul here this week ordered all Reich Nationals to resign immediately from the German Club because the club had failed to expel three members of German-Jewish descent.

The ultimatum threw the small German colony into an uproar.

Sakowsky previously indicated he favored expulsion but had not demanded it and his wishes had not been carried out.

A minority of the members were said to be Nazi sympathizers.

The club is known as a social organization. It is incorporated under the laws of the Philippines and members said that Sakowsky was acting improperly in attempting to force expulsions.

It was reported that he would request Prince Louis Ferdinand of Prussia, grandson of the former Kaiser, not to accept the club's hospitality when he arrives here on a visit, August 27.

## Italy to Oust Jews From Newspapers

ROME.—Informed Fascist quarters said this week a campaign had been begun to oust Jews and Jewish interests from Italian journalism.

Two big newspapers possessing Jewish capital were said to have changed hands this week. It was reported that the Jewish editor of Il Corriere Adriatico has been replaced.

Fascists said a complete purge of newspapers probably will race policy. The newspapers reported to have changed hands were the authoritative Giornale D'Italia and Il Piccolo, published in Trieste.

A small amount of Jewish capital was behind Il Giornale D'Italia, Rome's most important daily.

VALENCIA, Spain.—The body of Ben Leider, American aviator shot down in the Spanish war, was sent to Marseilles last week en route to New York.

## Arabs Are Pushing Land Mine Tactics

JERUSALEM.—Arabs emboldened by the success of their land mine tactics, were reported drawing closer to Palestine's main towns in the unabated strife in the Holy Land.

Two new land mines were removed from the Jericho-Jerusalem highway just before a potash convoy passed.

Two British soldiers were killed yesterday when their truck struck a land mine between Nabulus and Jenin.

## Canada Admits 173 Immigrants

OTTAWA.—Somewhat more than 2 per cent of all the immigrants admitted to Canada during the first half of 1923 were Jews, statistics made public by the Immigration Department revealed. Of the total of 8,135 immigrants only 173 were Jews.

## New Synagogue Scheduled To Open for High Holiday

A new Synagogue, Congregation Sons of Abraham, designed to attract the younger Jewish element in this city, is being constructed at the corner of Prairie and Potters avenues, with a six hundred seating capacity. Samuel Bomes, treasurer and one of the charter members, said today, "It is expected that the Synagogue will be ready for the High Holidays." Mr. Leach, in a statement today, said that the Synagogue will be conducted in a "modern orthodox fashion." Men and women worshippers will be seated on the main floor. ## Nazi Menace Overrated, Says Investigator - Denounces Reds

### Claims Anti-Nazi Unit Has Communistic Aid Dies to Pursue Red Trail Now

WASHINGTON, D. C.—There is little evidence of Nazi activities on the Pacific Coast, Edward F. Sullivan, special investigator for the House Committee investigating un-American activities, asserted in a report filed with the committee. He said that while Jewish organizations "are naturally concerned" about the activities of the German-American Bund and the Silver Shirts, "this concern is not shared by any other agency" or officials with whom he talked.

Sullivan declared that "the only evidence presented regarding Nazi activities was the picketing of a Jewish meeting at the Amba-

## Kidnaped Tel Aviv Youth is Released Held Blindfolded For Eight Days

TEL AVIV.—One of the most amazing crimes this all-Jewish city has known came nearer solution with the return by his captors of Zechariah Kikyon, twenty-year-old Tel Aviv Municipality employee who on the night of July 31 was called out of his parent's home and kidnaped. He was released in the vicinity of Petach Tikvah by his abductors, on whom strong pressure had been brought to bear in the past week.

Kikyon told police that when he was called out of his home on July 31, he was hit on the head so that he lost consciousness. He awoke in a car, to find himself tied hand and foot and blindfolded. He remained in that condition for eight days and never knew where his prison was. Police instituted a widespread investigation to ascertain the place of his concealment.

She was seventy-four years of age.

## Children Adrift on Danube Rescued by Youth Aliyah

NEW YORK.—Jewish children who were among the Austrian exiles expelled from Burgenland by Nazis and set adrift on the Danube four months ago will be rescued by the Youth Aliyah (immigration) movement and sent to Palestine before September 30, it was learned here today.

The news was cabled from Youth Aliyah headquarters in London to Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America, sole agency in the United States for this immigration movement which transfers Jewish children from Central Europe to Palestine.

Seven hundred and seven certificates permitting entrance into Palestine for as many boys and girls between the ages of 15 and 17 have just been issued by the British Government.

Mrs. David B. Greenberg of Mt.

Vernon, N. Y., national Youth Aliyah chairman of Hadassah disclosed. The certificates will be applied against a special immigration schedule for students which is operative in Palestine until September 30.

The cable read: "Seven hundred and seven certificates approved; saving Burgenlander children marooned Danube immediately after Austrian conquest."

## Reich Places Ban On Sugar For Jews

BERLIN.—Sugar probably will be a thing of the past soon for Austrian Jewish bakeries, candy factories and dealers in sugar.

By order of the commissioner in charge of the sugar industry in Austria, Jewish firms dealing in sugar and "using sugar in their establishments for manufacturing purposes" will not receive supplies after Thursday. Presumably this also affect Jewish coffee houses.

## Police Halt Boy's Trip to Palestine

WARSAW.—Six Jewish boys between the ages of 12 and 15 who set out in two rowboats for Palestine found their odyssey brought to an abrupt halt at Plotzk, some 50 miles up the Vistula, whence police navigated them by land back to the bosoms of their families in Warsaw.

Under the leadership of Admiral Ezekiel Rinder, 15, the youths managed to get together a few hundred zlotys, with which they thought the rowboats and provided themselves with food, an oil stove, and other provisions which they felt necessary for the voy-

## Vienna Jews Face Nazi Treason Trial

VIENNA.—Dr. Robert Stricker, prominent Zionist leader, and Dr. Desidir Friedman, former president of the Vienna Jewish Community, who have been under arrest since March when the Nazis conquered Austria, are to be tried on charges of high treason. The basis of the charges is their support of the regime of Chancellor Kurt Schuschnigg.

Stricker and Friedman are reported to be critically ill in a concentration camp. Ten of the 28 B'nai Brith officials who were arrested in March are reported to have died in prison. Meanwhile, a new wave of Jewish suicides has begun as a result of the mass dispossession of thousands of Jewish families from Aryan-owned houses and apartments.

## Demands Inquiry Into Bund Camps

SCRANTON, Pa.—An investigation of the German-American Bund and the expulsion of members associated with bund camps was demanded this week in a resolution placed before Pennsylvania legionnaires at their twentieth annual State convention.


Denouncing bund camps as a "cover for espionage work," the resolution urged the United States to sever diplomatic relations with Germany if the investigation disclosed that the bund was financed by the Nazi government.

## Consul Urges Open Meetings in Canada

WINNIPEG, Man.—Wilhelm Rodde, German consul in Winnipeg, told 5,000 members of the Canadian-German League, that it was time Germans in Canada celebrated Nazi events "not behind closed doors but open in the public."

A resolution was unanimously adopted acclaiming Austro-German Anschluss. It was also "regretted" that "the campaign of vilification of the German nation by news agencies and so-called

## Reich Law Applies To Nazis Everywhere

NEW YORK. — That the laws of Nazi Germany cover the actions of German citizens, even when they are outside the Third Reich, was reaffirmed the other day by the German Supreme Court in a case reported in a Berlin dispatch to the New York Staats-Zeitung.

It appears that a German Jew had sent his German Aryan girl friend abroad for a trip and later had visited her there. Charged with violation of the Nuremberg laws against so-called "race defilement," the Jew was convicted regardless of the fact that the "crime" had been committed in another country.

## Urge Frankfurter as Cardozo Successor

WAUPACA, Wis.—In an open letter to President Roosevelt, famed United States Senator George W. Norris of Nebraska, last week urged the appointment of Felix Frankfurter, advisor to the President, and a professor of law at Harvard, as justice of the United States Supreme Court to succeed the late Justice Benjamin Cardozo.

The Nebraska liberal issued the statement from his summer home near here.

## Brazil to Admit Reich Exiles May Restrict Industrialists

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil.—Working ten hours a day, the four members of the Commission for the Permanency of Foreigners in Brazil, have, in a few days, decided the fate of several hundreds of foreign exiles from among several thousands who entered Brazil on tourist visas and continued to remain illegally in the country beyond the six months allotted them. At least for these few, now accepted by Brazil, life takes on a different hue; the fear of expulsion to an unknown fate is past.

Assisting this commission, tens of helpers have been busy taking affidavits, cataloguing records and passing on applications. Mountains of applications lie on top of the large oval table of the tellers—the men whose job it is to


read the affidavits, written in many languages, filing reams of paper, consisting of passports, police statements, birth certificates and what not.

### Will Restrict Admissions

Among the Germans here are scientists and professional men, but most are industrialists and small merchants. Few are agricultural workers, so greatly needed by Brazil.

Although accepting those foreigners who entered and remained in the country against the law, Brazil will not further countenance the indiscriminate entry of foreigners beyond the limits prescribed by law. It is believed, however, that Brazil will, with certain restrictions, accept some exiled foreigners.

## 25,000 Get Work From Reich Exiles

LONDON.—Some 25,000 Englishmen have been employed by refugees who have made their home in England, it was pointed out here by Sir John Hope Simpson in a lecture before the Liberal Summer School at Oxford. Sir John, who is director of the Refugee Survey of the Royal Institute of International Affairs, declared the figure exceeded the number of refugees.

He praised Jewish organizations for their assistance to the refugees and urged the British Government to withdraw the regulation obliging refugees to sign declarations that they would not take work, whether paid or otherwise, after admission to the country.

## Franco Seeks Jewish Volunteers for Army

## 12,000 Jews to Drop Italian Allegiance

PARIS.— Italy's anti-Jewish policy is expected to cause her serious economic injury in Tunis, North Africa, where 12,000 Jews who are Italian subjects are reported to have decided to abandon Italian allegiance and embrace French citizenship. ## Council to Guard Equal Jewish Rights

NEW YORK.—The General Council for Jewish Rights has been formed as a coordinating body to deal with the safeguarding of equal rights of Jews here and abroad, and its first meeting will be held here September 19.

The new council was set up by four Jewish organizations—the American Jewish Committee, the American Jewish Congress, the B'nai B'rith and the Jewish Labor Committee.

It was said that additional organizations might be admitted later. The new group is required to meet once every three months or on the request of seven representatives, and not more than two meetings a year may be held in New York City.

## Dr. Taylor Limits "Aryan" to Speech Cites Danger in Speaking Truth

CAMBRIDGE, England.—Education should swerve from the classical to emphasis of world problems in training youth "to deal intelligently with existing conditions" in a "world of clashing ideologies," Professor Thomas G. Taylor, of the University of Toronto, told the Association for the Advancement of Science this week.

### Danger to Dictators

While there is no risk today in teaching scientific fact, he continued, "there is grave danger in many circles in stating the truth about Communism, Socialism, Judaism, Nordicism and many otherisms which conflict with established or dictatorial interests." Discussing Jewry and Germany's

application of the word "Aryan," Professor Taylor declared "Aryan" can be "applied only to speech and 'Nordic' indicates breed and can be applied only to race."

The term "Jew," he said, should be used only in connection with religion, and the term should be "Jewish cult" rather than Jewish race, Jews, like Germans, are of two different races, he explained.

## Arab Terrorism

Two highly significant points are emphasized in a leader which appeared in the London Times on Wednesday, giving a survey of the present Palestine position.

The first refers to Jewish self-restraint. The second underlines the necessity for Anglo-French cooperation in the Near East.

The more popular of the British newspapers have reflected the public attitude towards Palestine by regarding the events in that country purely in terms of "interracial" conflict.

No one who is familiar with the history of Palestine can be impressed by this thesis. Indeed, the results of investigations show that since the Arab terror began, the terrorists have claimed more Arab victims than Jewish victims. The murder of moderate Arabs who refused to subscribe either financially or politically to the campaign of terrorism was an early feature of the Palestine troubles. It has continued with increasing intensity until the present day.

It is clear that the campaign of the Arab terrorists is directed indiscriminately against all peaceful elements in the community. The Times in its leader emphasizes this point, and declares, in a reference to the bomb explosions in crowded market places, that "the history of revolutions in the Near East shows that the Nationalist fanatic is ready to use any means to excite hatred against his opponents."

Coinciding, as these crimes did, with the departure of the Woodhead Commission and with the deliberations at Evian, they reveal that there is clever direction behind the moves of Arab terrorism.

## S. W. Africa Exposes Nazi Activities

JOHANNESBURG.—Possibility of a pan-African and Anglo-South African conference to consider

the menace of intensified Nazi activities in South West Africa is being discussed by prominent South African leaders, it is learned here.

An expose of Nazi activities in South West Africa has been followed by numerous press demands for strong action and an appeal to the Dutch Reformed Church, issued "in the name of many thousands of God-fearing Afrikaners," protesting against persecution of Jews and urging a fight against the Nazi menace.

## Reich Says It Won't Aid Refugees

BERLIN.—Hope that Germany might be prevailed upon to permit refugees to take with them some portion of their capital was dashed when the official Nazi press served notice on the Inter-governmental Refugee Aid Committee that it need expect no cooperation from the Reich.

The Nazi press declares it is foolish and futile to expect that Germany will allow the emigrating Jews to take with them "capital that they stole from Aryans."

## Solution of Bigotries Is Urged by Expert Makes Suggestion For Polish Jews

LONDON.—Elimination of economic and political conditions in Eastern Europe, especially organized anti-Semitic propaganda, that threaten to aggravate the already acute refugee problem by bringing about a new wave of Jewish persecution, is urged by Sir John Hope Simpson in a preliminary report of a survey of the refugee question published under auspices of the Royal Institute of International Affairs.

Recognized as an expert on refugee problems by virtue of his work with the Refugee Settlements Commission in Athens from 1926 to 1930. Sir John recommended radical and preventive action rather than superficial palliatives.

Specifically, he proposed agrarian reform in Poland to overcome dire poverty among the peasantry, which has resulted in discrimination against Jews.

## Mrs. Brin to Speak On Radio Wednesday

Mr. Arthur Brin, retiring president of the National Council of Jewish Women, will be guest speaker on Alma Kitchell's "Let's Talk It Over" program over the Blue Network of the National Broadcasting Company on Wednesday, August 31, from 2:15 to 2:30 o'clock, D. S. T.

Mrs. Brin, who has just returned from an investigation tour of Europe and Palestine will speak on "Impressions on the Outlook for Peace in Europe."

## A. Z. Idlesohn Dies; Composer Was 56

NEW YORK.—Dr. Abraham Z. Idlesohn, noted Jewish composer and musicologist and Professor Emeritus of Jewish Music and Liturgy at the Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati, died this week in Johannesburg, South Africa.

Dr. Idlesohn was 56 years old. Celebrated as having laid the foundations for the scientific study of Jewish music, Dr. Idlesohn left as his chief contribution his monumental ten-volume Thesaurus of Jewish melodies. He retired from active teaching in 1934 incapacitated by his illness and went to South Africa to join his family last year.

## Large German Group Censures Nazism

DETROIT.—Recognizing the degrading influence of Nazi propaganda in its effect upon the good name of the millions of German-Americans in this country, the American Turner Bund, one of the largest and most influential organizations of German-Americans (45,000 members.) This week passed resolutions at its annual convention repudiating any connection with the Nazis and condemning their undemocratic, un-American activities.

Copies were sent to President Roosevelt, Secretary of State Hull, and the members of the U. S. Senate and the House of Representatives.

## Michtor, Founder of Doll Industry, Dies

NEW YORK.—Morris Michtor, one of the pillars in the "Ort" organization in the U. S. and the founder of the American doll industry, who this week died in Brooklyn, arrived in this country in 1890.

## Subsidized Race Magazine On Sale Throughout Italy

ROME.—The first issue of La Difesa Della Razza (Defense of the Race) a fortnightly magazine for the propagation of the new Fascist race theories, was put on sale throughout Italy last week-end.

That the new magazine lives on government or party subventions is indicated by the fact that it prints almost no advertisements, while its one-lira sale price obviously is not enough to cover the cost of its publication. Of four advertisements printed in the first issue one is for a semi-governmental insurance company, another is for the air mail, the third is for the government tobacco monopoly and the fourth is for a railroad.

The magazine obviously is intended to deal with racial problems in a serious and scientific manner, but its anti-Semitic slant is obvious at first glance. The

cover carries a picture showing a short Roman sword separating the head of a Roman statue from a head obviously intended to represent that of a Jew and another of a Negro.

One article is devoted to trying to prove that Jews figure highest in various categories of 'criminals in such countries as Germany, including Austria, Hungary and The Netherlands. Another article is devoted to showing the "seven mortal sins" that Fascism has committed according to Jews.

Cartoons ridiculing Jews are scattered throughout the magazine bearing no relation to the text.

## Noted Pianist Under Fire by Anti-Semites

WARSAW.—The anti-Semitic forces in Poland have opened a campaign against the famous Polish pianist and ex-Premier, M. Padarewski.

The Jew baiters are highly indignant at the revelation that in 1914, a few months before the outbreak of the war, M. Padarewski undertook in America not to support any anti-Jewish campaign.

The anti-Semites demanded that M. Padarewski should now repudiate his pledge, threatening him with boycott if he refuses to do so.

## S. W. Jacobs Dies; Hired in Thaw Case

### First Jewish House Member

MONTREAL.—Samuel William Jacobs, 67, lawyer and first Jewish member of the House of Commons died at his home here after a year's illness. Mr. Jacobs had been a Liberal member for Cartier (Montreal) since 1917.

A native of Lancaster, Ont., he was graduated from McGill University here and then started on a legal career that brought him into many prominent cases.

One of the most widely reported was in Sherbrooke, Que., when Mr. Jacobs was associated with the late William Travers Jerome, acting for the Attorney General of the New York in seeking the return to the United States of Harry K. Thaw, who had escaped from the Matteawan (N. Y.) State Hospital in 1913 and fled across the Canadian border.

## German Diva to Adopt American Citizenship

NEW YORK.—Lotte Lehmann, famous German soprano, and her three stepsons, who are half-Jewish, entered the United States under the German immigration quota and plan to become American citizens, the Metropolitan Opera star announced on her arrival from Europe. The stepsons are Ludwig Krause, 23, Hans, 20, and Peter, 19.

Their father is Otto Krause, Mme. Lehmann's husband. Their mother, Krause's former wife, was Jewish. Because of this the Nazi authorities in Austria refused to let the youths leave but they managed to escape on May 5th. Mme. Lehmann's home in Vienna was taken over by the Nazis in April.

## Urge Establishment of Medical Center

LONDON.—Creation of a "new Vienna" in the native Indian state of Hyderabad by establishing there medical institutions staffed by prominent Austrian Jewish physicians is proposed by Dr. Gronney Bolton in the current issue of Spectator. Recalling that Jews from Bagdad had greatly benefited Calcutta and Bombay, and that a Jew, Lord Reading, had been viceroy of India, Dr. Bolton declares "in Hyderabad Jews could live in peace with Mohammedans and for centuries to come Hyderabad would call the present nizam (native ruler) blessed."

A similar plan for Mysore State in India is also suggested by Dr. Bolton. He proposes that a subsidy now paid to the British government by the Hindu ruler be used to maintain a Jewish-staffed medical center.

## Rabbi Gets 3 Years for \$20,000 Theft

NEW YORK.—White-bearded Rabbi Zeide M. Schmellner, 59, formerly of 80 Riverside Drive, sentenced this week to three to six years in Sing Sing for grand larceny.

His secretary, Mary Berd, drew a term of one to two years. Both were convicted on June 23.

The couple was convicted of the theft of \$20,000 from Bernard Rudolph who operates an electrical supply shop in the Bowery. He testified at the trial that the defendants had bilked him of his money by explaining that it was to be invested in a firm that was

# Italy Begins Jewish Resident Census

## Define Jews from Racial, Not Religious Point of View

ROME.—The official census of Jews residing in Italy is under way and will be completed Monday, it was announced this week. The old figures were said to be inaccurate because many Jewish families did not declare their religion while others had been converted to other religions and did not consider themselves Jews.

It was stressed that the census was being taken in accordance with Italy's racial doctrine which defines Jews from racial, not a religious point of view. According to this definition the Italians consider as a Jew "even he who for decades has adjured his faith and embraced another."

The census forms were distributed to all Jewish families, to those "in which hebraism is represented, even though by only one member and to those which on the basis of recent investigations were found to have had Jewish relatives in the past."

### Items in Questionnaire

The census questionnaire follows: "Citizenship: The nation must be specified while foreigners whose status is not defined at present must indicate their last nationality. Those who have acquired Italian citizenship indicate the State whence they come.

"Religion: Indicate the religion given one at the time of birth through rite or other act. Those who have abjured their former religion must indicate the new religion embraced and the date of the abjuration. Married persons must give the religion of their families. Israelites must name the community in which they are enrolled, give the date of their enrollment in the Fascist party, the

number of their membership card and their war record, if any.

"As for those absent at the time of the census the head of the family must give details indicating the location of the absentees and give reasons for their absence.

sador Hotel (Los Angeles) by members of the German-American Bund and the circulation of a very vicious circular attacking members of the Jewish race.

While these practices are unthinkable from the standpoint of true Americanism, the Los Angeles police have pointed out that it is within the constitutional right of these groups to protest or picket and the picketing of the Jewish meeting was retaliation for the Jewish and Communist groups picketing the German, Japanese and Italian consulates at an earlier date."

Sullivan attacked the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League as "an organization which has Communist and radical support and is well-supplied with funds." Among its supporters he said, "one will find the supporters of the Communist Party, American Committee for Aid to Spanish Democracy and other Communist and radical causes. It conducts a very lurid campaign over the radio five nights a week and is quite silent regarding Communism, as all so-called anti-Nazi groups are known to be. According to the Communists any one who is opposed to their policies is at once branded as a Nazi or a Fascist."

### LEARN NAZI TACTICS

LONDON.—Four hundred Italian blackshirts are going to Vienna shortly, the Daily Telegraph reported to receive special courses of instruction regarding application of anti-Semitism.

## Streicher Exhibit Moved to Vienna

VIENNA.—Julius Streicher, high priest of Nazi anti-Semitism has invaded Austria with his notorious anti-Semitic exhibit. "The Wandering Jew." Adding a special section on Austria the exhibit is being shown in Vienna as part of the campaign to keep anti-Jewish feeling at fever pitch.

The Austrian section includes pictures and documents dealing with Austrian Jews, many of whom are now in prison. The exhibit was first opened in Munich last year.

tire year. With the coming of the High Holidays, many attend Synagogues by merely purchasing seats for the occasion. Others attend services in improvised synagogues, usually located in a public meeting place and even in dance halls, rented for the period.

"Since these people are mostly Orthodox in background, a Synagogue such as is now being built, is needed to counteract this side-show religion, that is drawing so many of our co-religionists from Orthodox."

With the Synagogue modelled after the Young Judaea Synagogue in New York City, the officials plan to inculcate the principals of Judaism in the members, and impress them through a number of extra-curricula activities, which will emanate from the Synagogue, under the guidance of capable men. Further details concerning the Synagogue and its ideals will be published in a later edition of The Herald.

## Joshua Not Suitable Name For Nazis

BERLIN. — Joshua is not a good name for a good Nazi, the German Supreme Court ruled in granting permission to a young German to change the name because it "sounds Jewish"

The young man's father objected to the change because it was a family tradition to have a son named Joshua. But the court held with the son, declaring that every Aryan German is entitled to a name identified with German history or tradition.
