### The ORT Drive

Because of the dire need of vocational training and agricultural settlement for European Jews the work of the ORT today has special significance.

The statesmen who founded ORT and those who have carried it on to its present stage of usefulness are among the few who have had the insight to recognize that the emancipation of the Jewish people never could be complete until the whole range of vocations is made accessible to Jews, not only by the removal of positive restrictions, but also by a training process, technical and moral fitting Jews for occupations denied to them in the age of the Ghetto. Had the ideas of ORT been followed the Jews displaced from Germany would not now be in so desperate a plight. A large proportion of them would have been skilled artisans and farmers, whom any country would have welcomed.

There is the pressing need today for carrying through a systematic retraining of refugees, that they may escape the bitter alternative of charity or death. For this work there is no organization that can compare with ORT for experienced efficiency.

### Dogma of Hate

For more than three hours one night last week an audience of about 20,000 persons at Madison Square Garden had drummed into its ears the steady tom-tom of hatred.

They were gripped by the rhythmic appeal of competent speakers, practicing upon them the settled formula of the Nazi system—whatever is wrong, curse the Jew for it.

It was a revolting exhibition to eyes and ears bred in the tolerance of American tradition. It was a complete desecration, chanting this hate with American flags for a background a ceiling-high picture of George Washington looking down on the stage. It was a perfectly shocking appeal to the most degrading poisons in the human temper.

The speakers one after the other sneered heavily at democracy, free speech and a free country. The meeting was their answer. Nothing could give the lie to them so utterly as the very rights which they enjoyed—rights which their own dogma would deny to everyone else.

The crowning irony was the studied effort of these hate-spreaders to wrap themselves in the vestments of Americanism. Believe it or not, this was billed as a "Pro-American Rally."

### Sooner or Later

The time will come when Hitler's 70,000,000 dupes will realize how idiotic it is to go hungry in order to give the products of their labor to Peruvians and Turks at less than cost. In the end Hitler's economic system will discredit him with his own people. It is a nice question whether foreign adventures will hasten or retard the inevitable day of reckoning. — Chicago Tribune.

NEW YORK.—"We can best defend the principles of democracy before others by the way we practice them ourselves," Mrs. Herbert H. Lehman, wife of the Governor of New York, declared in a recent nation-wide broadcast of an interview with Kate Smith, noted radio star.

"It seems to me that charity is of the essence of democracy," Mrs. Lehman said. "It isn't enough to enjoy the privileges of a free society. We must also be willing to share them with others."

### Says Youth Would Reject Fascism

NEW YORK.—If American youth had to choose between communism and fascism, fascism would be overwhelmingly rejected, reports John Gunther, author of "Inside Europe," after polls at a recent conference of selected young men and women.

"Fascism is capitalist democracy with the fig leaf missing," said one young man. While a majority prefer democracy to any "ism," a larger number favor a democracy evolving into socialism, says Mr. Gunther, who tells the details in McCall's Magazine.

### Score Race Theory As War on Religion

NEW YORK.—The Rev. Thomas J. Feeney, associate editor of Jesuit Missions, denounced the theory of race supremacy as an "outspoken war against all religion."

"Racism violates the inherent rights of parents to the education of their children," said the priest, "a right guaranteed by the natural law itself." Rev. Feeney urged the purging of our press and the channels of communications of all racial propaganda, foreign or domestic so that truth and understanding may be strengthened.

NEW YORK.—Unqualified opposition to exportation of German goods by Jews leaving Germany has been voted by the Joint Boycott Council of the American Jewish Congress and the Jewish Labor Committee.

The decision has been cabled to Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, who is now in London collaborating with the Inter-Governmental Refugee Committee which has arrived at a plan whereby Jews leaving Germany would take 15 per cent of their property in German goods.

Declaring that the Nazi regime is now on the brink of economic breakdown as a result of a six-year boycott of its goods, Dr. Joseph Tenenbaum, chairman of the council, said that Germany sees the 15 per cent plan as a big outlet for its products.

### Expects New Regime

"We shall not have to wait long now for a change in the Nazi government and then the refugee problem will not exist any longer," Dr. Tenenbaum told council members at a meeting at the Astor. "The Third Reich has lost nearly one billion marks in foreign trade in the last year. Hitler himself said, 'Germany must export or die.'

It was predicted that the council's opposition might imperil the Rublee accord reached at London. Dr. Tenenbaum, however, said that refugees bringing goods from Germany would be forced to sell them and that other markets would soon be flooded with German products.

### Bill Would Prohibit Licensing of Aliens

ALBANY, N. Y.—A bill to prohibit the future licensing of aliens to practice medicine, dentistry, professional engineering, architecture and accounting in New York State was introduced by Assemblyman Leo A. Lawrence of Herkimer County.

### Find Einstein's Kin In Refugee Camp

PERPIGNAN, France Karl Einstein, 55 years old, a nephew of the scientist, Albert Einstein, was found in a French concentration camp for Spanish government soldiers by newspaper men last week.

Einstein, a former professor of political economy at the University of Madrid and later a captain of infantry, had a German passport. He said he was continuing to Paris, where he has a home, and hoped to exchange his passport for a Nansen Refugee Committee pass so he could join his uncle at Princeton, N. J.

"I found I enjoyed being a soldier more than being a professor," he said.

# Little Faith Placed in London Talk Between Jews, Arabs

**Arab Nationalism Hardened; Hit British Method of Divide and Rule.**

JERUSALEM. — With fresh Arab terrorism breaking out in the last few days, things look black in the Holy Land.

No man is allowed to travel anywhere in Palestine without a military pass and identity card. All permits for Arab taxis have been withdrawn. Telephone wires have been cut, courts closed, building gutted. Martial law reigns, and it is death to carry munitions without a permit. The British have the country in hand now, but the murders and bombings persist; in the small villages back in the hills there continue the same bridandage, sniping and movements of rebels.

The much-heralded conference between the Jews and the Arab leaders of all the Near East, being held in London during this month, is a big thing. But there are few who believe any conference can solve the problem of the Jews and the Arabs. The Jews know they will have to make concessions to the Arabs; the Arabs know they will not get their full demands and are suspicious. But the Arabs hold the trump card with their terrorizing, which is driving money and men from Pal-

## Nazis to Dominate Tiny Liechtenstein

### Mass Troops Along Border

LONDON. — The Exchange Telegraph Agency reported this week from Zurich that negotiations were under way in Vienna to bring the tiny sovereign state of Liechtenstein and its 11,000 inhabitants under domination of Germany.

German authorities were said to be conferring on the matter with the Prince of Liechtenstein, Frantz Joseph, who succeeded his uncle, Prince Frantz I, as ruler when the latter abdicated last March 30.

### Troops Mobilized

According to the dispatch, the Prince has large estates in Austria and Czechoslovakia and threats to expropriate these estates apparently are being made by Berlin to force consent to "anschluss."

It was asserted that Germany did not contemplate military occupation of the sixty-five square-mile principality, but sought to achieve "bleidenhshaltung," or economic co-operation.

## Harder for Jewish Lawyers To Earn Living Says Survey

NEW YORK.—Jewish lawyers find it more difficult than their colleagues to earn a subsistence income, according to a study of the situation in New York City on the basis of 11,400 attorneys believed to be Jewish. The study, prepared by Melvin M. Fagen, executive secretary of the Conference on Jewish Relations, and entitled "Status of Jewish Lawyers in New York City," appears in the first issue of Jewish Social Studies, quarterly journal of the conference.

Fagen summarizes the results of his study as follows: ". . . Jewish lawyers in New York City find it more difficult to earn a subsistence income than do their colleagues in the profession, that proportionately fewer of them earn large incomes, that they enter the profession with less collegiate training and largely from evening law schools and that they are largely confined to the individual practice of law rather than

### New Laws Order Expulsion of Jews

NEW YORK.—Laws promulgated by Czechoslovakian ordered, first, revision of the status of all Czechs whose citizenship was acquired after Nov. 1, 1918, or who on Jan. 1, 1938, lived in territory now ceded to Germany, Poland or Hungary. Secondly, the new laws ordered the "liquidation" of immigrants at present living in Czech territory.

The text of the laws does not specifically mention Jews, but it is mostly Jews who are affected. The persons coming within the scope of these laws must report to the authorities. Afterward the provincial councils will decide the question of citizenship. Except in extraordinary cases, which can be referred to the Ministry of the Interior, there is no provision for appeals from the provincial council's decisions.



## Edouard Daladier

BY CAL TINNEY

Dear Vice-President Garner:

I hope you don't mind if I write you a letter. About all you Vice-Presidents get to do is open mail, anyway. And I thought it wouldn't hurt to write you a letter and tell you that the guy they have got running France now is a French edition of you.

No fooling, this Premier Daladier is a Jack Garner in the way he keeps his mouth shut except on the most special occasions, the way he appreciates a joke, the way he is not afraid of anybody, and the way he is easy-going till somebody tries his patience too much, and then he gives you a first-class imitation of Ferdinand after the bee stung him.

### What's It All Djibouti?

Mussolini is going to find that out if he keeps nagging about Djibouti, and Tunisia, and a few other places. Now France has so many possessions—her empire is second only to John Bull's in size—that it's hard for the French to remember all of them, and when Mussolini first started demanding Djibouti, the French looked at one another and said, "Have we got a Djibouti?"

That's where Il Duce made his mistake. If he had just gone ahead and taken Djibouti without asking for it the French never would have missed it.

If this agitation between France and Italy really does flare up into something, it is going to annoy Edouard Daladier a lot. He likes to sleep late of a morning, but a French Premier must get up around seven a. m. if his schedule says he must shuck a crisis that day.

### He's a Table-Pounder

As if he wasn't careless enough of his health already, Daladier, at fifty-four, doesn't get much exercise. That is, unless you want to call lifting the telephone to call Chamberlain is exercise. Edouard does that a lot.

He makes a speech with his head down, and that is how come his colleagues in the French Chamber of Deputies nicknamed him "The Bull." He looks like he might charge into them any minute.

Not yet has he done anything that violent, but he does pound the table if he is speaking. And, boy, does he pound! When they announce in the Chamber of Deputies, "Premier Daladier is going to speak," you can practically see the furniture cringe.

As for what Edouard Daladier's beliefs are, they're simple. He believes in (1) democracy, (2) a strong army, (3) tolerance of labor for capital and of capital for labor, and (4) moderation.

### Product of a Small Town

The name of his party in France doesn't mean a thing. It's "Radical-Socialist," but the people that belong to it are neither radicals nor socialists. Their equivalent in this country is the conservative wing of the Democratic Party.

After the war Daladier went into politics as the pet of one of his old college professors who was then making a name in Paris—Edouard Herriot. Daladier served Herriot in several Cabinets and in 1933 became Premier.

His first official act was to shave off his mustache so he wouldn't look like Adolf Hitler.

In 1934 he let the police of Paris fire on rioters, and lost office as a result. Overnight he was about as popular as a sheepherder at a rodeo. People even called him "assassin."

### Danger—Munich's Ahead

But two years later he was back in politics and going strong. Last spring the Blum government "fell," as they say in France, and the "assassin" of four years before was put back in the Premiership.

He told the French equivalent of our Congress "You've got the country in such a mess now I'll have to have decree powers to get it out." Well, they gave 'em to him. And he's used 'em, too.

As a matter of fact, the only way he's stayed popular is that as soon as he takes a slap at labor he turns around quick and takes one at capital, too. Daladier will stay popular as long as the French voter enjoys the other fellow's pain more than he disenjoys his own.

Nor did "The Bull" do anything at Munich that got him in bad with the French voters. But now that Mussolini, too, is yelling for land, French voters are asking, "Just how many Munichs has there got to be!"

Well, that's all I had to say, Mr. Vice-President, except if I was Mussolini I would remember that every joy-ride doesn't end at Munich. There was one that ended at Waterloo.





Montreal authorities are also considering banning the film as "propaganda."



The report also stated that there is a widespread need of dental care for all classes in the area surveyed by the Association.

NEW YORK—First apartments in Metropolitan Life's \$65,000,000 development in Bronx will be ready for occupancy on October 1. Rent schedules are now being prepared—will probably be around \$12 a room.

**Police Report**

A slump in the number of robberies solved was revealed this week in the report of Superintendent of Police John J. Parker, released this week by the Bureau of Police and Fire. ## Disturbances Mark Bund Holiday Rally

13 Arrests Made,  
Several Injured

NEW YORK.—Nineteen thousand members and friends of the German-American Bund rallied in Madison Square Garden this week behind a police cordon "strong enough to stop a revolution," to celebrate the birthday of George Washington.

Outside a considerably larger crowd made two organized efforts to stampede the police lines, and kept up a desultory attack from 6:30 P. M. until the meeting ended, close to midnight.

Thirteen arrests were made on minor charges and several persons, including police, were treated for minor injuries.

Charges of police brutality in defending the Bund were aired today when the Socialist Workers' Party announced its intention of calling at the Mayor's office to protest. Police slugged and rode down anti-Fascist demonstrators, they asserted, and this, in their opinion, was a betrayal by the Mayor of hundreds of thousands of labor voters.

Inside the Garden two incidents marred the harmony of the meeting. One occurred when the persistent laughter of Miss Dorothy Thompson, a columnist, was considered provocative and caused her ejection. The other was when a solitary demonstrator rushed the platform, where the bund's führer, Fritz Kuhn, was orating pierced the cordon of Storm Troopers to within six feet of the speaker, and was overpowered, untroussered and delivered to the law.

## Foreign Jews in Italy Face Imprisonment

### Must Leave Before March 12

ROME.—Foreign Jews unable to leave Italy before March 12, deadline for compliance with last October's expulsion decree, will be placed in concentration camps on an island off the south of Italy, according to information here. In the meantime increasing pressure is being exercised against foreign Jews, who are being summoned by the police and warned to leave the country before the expiration date.

All Jewish officers in the Italian military and naval services have been dismissed, it was officially noted.

Under the auspices of the race publication, Difesa della Razza, an anti-Semitic exhibit opened at Piazza Colonna, featuring a free library containing anti-Semitic literature and explanations of the Fascist race theory. Despite great fanfare, the display has thus far aroused little attention.
