## EDMONSON SEEKS ARYAN TRIAL JURY

### Claims Jews Raised Wall Against Recovery

New York (WNS)—"My long and varied business and professional experience has provided me with knowledge which enables me to identify positively the sinister Jewish leadership forces which are subverting American political, religious, economic and social life, and raising a mysterious wall against recovery," is one of the statements contained in an affidavit filed by Robert Edward Edmondson, publisher of anti-Semitic tracts, who has pleaded Not Guilty to charge of criminal libel brought against him because of his anti-Semitic activity.

In a motion brought by his counsel Edmondson argues that the June Grand Jury, which indicted him, "was illegally and defectively constituted in that a majority thereof consisted of Mongrel Jews" and that his case demands a Grand Jury composed of "native-born Aryan Christian Americans."

## Jewish Children Strike

### Refuse Food in Protest of Cold-Blooded Murders

Warsaw (WNS)—Several thousand Jewish children here who witnessed the cold-blooded murder of one of their number by three Polish boys have declared a hunger strike as a gesture of mourning and protest. It was during a Jewish picnic near Warsaw that the Jewish youngster was thrown into a lake by the Polish boys, and drowned. At Legionowo, near here, Solomon Miller, 34, was shot and killed by anti-Semites.

To a Jewish delegation whom he received Premier Skladkowski gave renewed assurances of protection for Polish Jews.

## Dickstein Gets Summons For Anti-Semitic Editor

New York (WNS)—A summons for the arrest of William Zenger, publisher of the defunct National American, official organ of the anti-Semitic American National Labor Party, was obtained in West Side Court by Representative Samuel Dickstein, member of the Congressional committee to investigate anti-American activities. Mr. Dickstein charges that the January 16th issue of the National American accused him of profiting personally from the investigation.

## Rush To Liquidate Affairs As New Nazi Drive Impends

## Marriages May Be Annulled Sensational Ruling Disturbs Thousands of Couples

Berlin (WNS)—Thousands of marriages in which either the husband or wife is Jewish were threatened with dissolution as the result of a sensational ruling by a Cologne Nazi court, which dissolved a marriage between a non-Aryan and a German Jewish girl which had been made in 1930, five years before the Nazis banned such marriages. If this ruling is accepted as a precedent thousands of families will be broken up.

Ludwig Lion, 50-year-old Jewish physician who was in a Potsdam prison awaiting trial on a charge of "Rassensehande," was found dead of poison in his cell by a jailer who went to bring him before the court.

## G-MEN TO WAR ON POULTRY RACKETEERS

### "Feeling of Fear and Terror" Must Be Removed

New York (WNS)—Assured of the cooperation of the Departments of Justice and Agriculture in his war on racketeers in the kosher poultry trade, Market Commissioner William F. Morgan, Jr., has served notice on operators of kosher poultry slaughterhouses that the employment contract which the shoetim's union is attempting to force upon them is a direct violation of a Federal court decree.

The decree perpetually restrained the shoetim's unions and 49 individuals from creating or attempting to create "a feeling of fear and terror" for the purpose of preventing live poultry dealers "from buying, selling or distributing live poultry in a free, open and competitive market."

## Report 33 British Dead in Palestine Riots

London (WNS-Palcor Agency)—Thirty-three British soldiers and Colonial troops were either wounded or killed in Palestine this year, it transpired during an exchange of questions between W. Gallacher, Communist, and Alfred Duff-Cooper, Conservative, in the House of Commons.

## Hebrew Paper Asks Again

### What Happened to Palestine Emergency Fund

New York (WNS)—The demand of David A. Brown to place the Palestine Emergency Fund of 1929 at the disposal of the sufferers from the present Palestine disturbances, made public several weeks ago, through the Seven Arts Feature Syndicate, has been taken up by the Hebrew press in Palestine, according to a dispatch to the New York Times.

The dispatch quotes an editorial from the Hadasoth Aharanot, Jerusalem Hebrew daily, which asks for a reply to the question as to why the 1929 fund is being used to finance "all sorts of companies without the slightest notion of what is being done."

"What is the relationship between these companies and the relief fund?" the editorial asks. "It is not quite clear that American Jewry, which gave almost 80 per cent. of that fund, meant it to be for emergency relief and riot sufferers and not for this or that investment? To all these questions there is no reply."

## Turkish Colleagues Force Professors to Leave

Istanbul (WNS)—Unwilling to endure any longer anti-Semitic attacks by their Turkish colleagues and students, the 19 German Jewish professors, physicians and scientists who were given posts in the Universities of Istanbul and Angora three years ago by the Turkish Government have announced their refusal to remain in Turkey after the expiration of their contracts.

Although the government papers and Turkish officials continued to praise the achievements of the refugees in establishing hospitals, instituting sanitary reforms and modernizing the country's scientific equipment, they are determined to leave. The anti-Semitic attacks arose when native savants resented the intrusion of foreigners whose improved methods were discrediting them.

## Judge Reprimands Arab Witnesses in Arson Case

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—An Arab prosecutor and Arab witnesses were severely reprimanded in the Jaffa District Court for giving false testimony by Judge Randolph Copland, who acquitted four Jews charged with arson at the outbreak of the disorders. One of the defendants was a Moslem convert to Judaism.

### Seventy Years Old

### Any Halt On Immigration Will Be Firmly Resisted, Says Wise

Judge Julian W. Mack will be three score and ten on Sunday. His seventieth anniversary draws attention to his distinguished part in the development of the Zionist movement in this country. He was one of the key personalities in the first American Jewish Congress, which sent a delegation to the Versailles Peace Conference, and is a delegate-at-large to the first World Jewish Congress scheduled to open in Geneva on August 8.

## World Labor to Strengthen Anti-Nazi Boycott Bloc

London (WNS)—Measures for strengthening the anti-Nazi boycott are being considered by the International Trade Unions Congress, now in session here. Sir Walter Citrine, president of the Congress, said that the boycott "is more effective than many of us realize, but it must be made more effective still."

He also told the Congress that he believed Fascism is on the wane as a result of the electoral triumphs of anti-Fascist groups in Belgium, France and Spain. The Congress was thrown into a temporary uproar when representatives of Nazi labor unions sought admission. They were told in vigorous language that they were officially barred.

## Deathbed Confession Proves Leading Doctor Is Jew

### Istanbul (WNS)—The deathbed confession of one of Istanbul's most beloved physicians, Dr. Mahmud, that he was a Jewish convert to Islam has created a sensation here.

Shortly before he died Dr. Mahmud called his friends to his bedside and asked them to witness a statement in which he declared that he was a Russian Jew who had embraced Mohammedanism after the War, and asked to be buried in the Jewish cemetery.

In his statement he revealed that he served as a physician in the White Armies of Russia and fled to Turkey in 1920. Barred from the practice of medicine as an alien, he became converted to Islam and changed his name, originally Michael Struck. Informed of Mahmud's deathbed statement, the Chief Rabbi sought to conceal it and refused to permit his burial in the Jewish cemetery, but the governor of Istanbul ordered burial in the Jewish cemetery on the ground that "every one has a right to believe in whatever religion he wishes."

London (WNS-Palcor Agency)—Dr. Stephen S. Wise, president of the Zionist Organization of America, in an interview with Colonial Secretary Ormsby-Gore warned that any attempt to yield to Arab violence by halting Jewish immigration into Palestine would meet with "firm and world-wide resistance by the Jewish people." Commenting on his interview with Mr. Ormsby-Gore, Dr. Wise told the Palcor News Agency that he had found the former "as always a sympathetic and understanding observer of developments in Palestine, who appreciates the meaning of the Mandate and connected problems."

"It is inconceivable for British prestige that there will be a violation of the trusteeship of the League," said Dr. Wise. "We must, however, bear in mind the pressure upon the Colonial Secretary in favor of Arab interests. It has been proposed, following the unhappy precedent of 1929, that Jewish immigration should be suspended during the work of the Royal Commission."

"Such a proposal is intolerable and if mooted by the Government will meet with firm and world-wide resistance of the Jewish people."

## Pioneering Era Opens

### First Hightstown Settlers Begin New Lives

Hightstown, N. J. (WNS)—A new era of Jewish pioneering in America was ushered in here with the arrival of the first seven Jewish families from Brooklyn and the Bronx who were selected as the first settlers of Jersey Homesteads, the Federal Rural Resettlement Administration project for establishing a garment center in agricultural surroundings for 200 Jewish needle trades workers.

Arriving in buses from New York, the pioneers, 25 of them, began a new life in flat-roofed, cinder-blocked one-story houses, each of which has an acre of garden land.

The settlers will work in a \$100,000 garment factory scheduled to begin operations in a fortnight, when eight more families arrive. The factory will be conducted on a co-operative basis. The entire project cost \$1,000,000. Walter A. Simon is community manager, and Samuel Herlinger will manage the factory.

## Congress to Last 10 Days

### Sessions Will Be Held in League Hall, Geneva

Geneva (WNS)—The sessions of the first World Jewish Congress will begin on the evening of August 8th and will continue for approximately 10 days, the Geneva bureau of the Committee of Jewish Delegations announces. All sessions will be held in the municipal Batiment Electoral, known as the League of Nations Hall, because it usually houses the large assemblies of the League. Conference committees and bureaus of the Congress will be chosen after August 8th. The Federation of Swiss Jewish Communities has elected 3 delegates to the Congress.

# CONTRACT BRIDGE

THE TAKEOUT DOUBLE  
(Continued)

Now you will recall that a double is meant, under other conditions previously stated for a takeout, when the doubled bid is not more than one No Trump or not more than two in a suit. Now there are also certain conditions when a double of a pre-emptive bid of three or four is also meant for a takeout. A double of a pre-emptive bid is an INVITATION, not a compulsion, for partner to takeout. IF HIS HAND WARRANTS IT, (conditions will be stated below), but to pass for penalties if his hand contains balanced strength, or is so weak that a higher suit contract would be hopeless and perhaps dangerous.

Remember that a pre-emptive bidder contains usually a hand that is strong offensively but not defensively, and that he will open with less than 2½ Honor Tricks if his trump suit is sufficiently long. In such cases it is not unusual for fourth hand to hold as many as three or more Honor Tricks. Such a double is called a co-operative double because it leaves it up to the partner of the doubler for discretionary action. He may pass for penalties or because of a weak hand, or he may bid with strength as defined below.

### Requirements and Responses to Pre-emptive Doubles

A double of an original bid three in a suit shows that the doubler has at least FOUR honor tricks and also at least three cards in each of the unbid suits. His partner should takeout with 1½ Honor Tricks including a five card biddable suit.

A double of a pre-emptive four in a suit shows at least 3½ HT with at least three cards in each of the unbid suits. Partner should takeout with 2 HT and a five card biddable suit.

Farther may pass for penalties when he values his own hand in conjunction

with the known honor strength of his partner and feels that the contract can be set at least two tricks. He may pass from choice with a hand containing less than 1½ HT.

Six couples met for the initial meeting at our home in Harrington for the purposes of playing duplicate contract. None to some, it was, at its conclusion, voted to make it a permanent club with regular monthly meetings and to include an additional couple. Altogether fifteen boards were played, and top score was won by Freida Feldman and Jack Goodman. Tied for second were Mr. and Mrs. Jack Leichter and Mr. and Mrs. Sam Finegold. One-half point behind them were Mr. and Mrs. Morris Cowen, with Miriam Borside and Walter Rutman next. Mr. and Mrs. Al Fain had a bad night and finished last, although their usual place in the final standing is at or near the top.

We would like to create a little more interest among bridge players in this form of tournament because it is most interesting and even exciting. Going into the last three hands it was a toss up as to which of the first four couples would win, and it was only in the final stretch that the victors pulled out on top, by a single point.

The ideal tournament for private homes is for six, seven, or eight couples and should be received any inquiries from those interested in forming their own club, we would be glad to co-operate and furnish details of organization and management. Expenses for such a club, which includes a nightly prize, and final grand prize, as well as all the paraphernalia is met by taxing each couple fifty cents or more each evening.

## DEMAND ROUMANIA END ANTI-SEMITISM

### Education Dept. Prevents Graduation of Jews

Bucharest (WNS)—While Foreign Minister Nicolae Titulescu was demanding that Premier Georg Tatarescu's government take immediate steps to change its pro-Nazi policy and alter its tolerant attitude toward anti-Jewish agitation, the educational authorities succeeded in preventing the graduation of at least 80 per cent of all Jewish students in the universities, by giving passing marks to only 20 per cent of Jewish students taking final examinations for admission to the professions.

This record of failure is attributed to the desire of the university authorities to curb Jews in the professions.

### Nine Arabs Killed

#### In Pitched Battle With British Troops in Safed Hills

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—In a pitched battle between British soldiers and 50 armed Arabs in the hills of Safed two Arabs were killed and an undetermined number of others were either wounded or slain.

The Arabs had recently been terrorizing the Jews of Safed and the surrounding districts, and had been intimidating other Arabs. Sergeant Harrison York of the Lancaster Regiment was accidentally killed after the battle when a transport lorry overturned. He was the fifth British soldier to fall since the beginning of the disturbances.

Seven Arab bandits were killed in the Jenin district when troops from Jenin came to the rescue of a telephone wire repair crew whom the Arabs attacked.

### Arab Terrorists Adopt New Forms of Sabotage

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—Arab terrorists have adopted a new form of railway sabotage. It was discovered when a military patrol narrowly escaped serious injury when its car was derailed near Kalkilya. This consists of bending rails out of line, a form of sabotage which is not as easily noticed as lines which have been blown up, and therefore is likely to cause grave accidents.

The Arab press continues to publish rumors that Jewish immigration will be suspended with the arrival of the Royal Commission from London. Al Hifa, organ of the Grand Mufti, stated that the Arabs demand not merely the stoppage of Jewish immigration but a complete change of British policy in Palestine.

## ACQUITTED JEWS GET DEATH THREAT

### Polish Press Angered at Jewish Protests

Warsaw (WNS)—Anonymous letters threatening them with death have been received by the three Jewish defendants who were acquitted in the Praytky pogrom trial. These threats and the ill-disposed anger of the Polish press against the Jews because of the militant protests against the outcome of the trial have served notice on Polish Jews that the Praytky case is far from closed.

Jewish leaders are gratified at the news that the Ukrainian Senator Lutski and a number of influential Ukrainian leaders, including priests, have undertaken a campaign against anti-Semitic agitation among their people. The anti-Semites accused of participation in the Shelditza pogrom several months ago were freed by the Radom district court. Two of them were found guilty, but were reprieved by the district governor.

### Six Jews Accompany American Olympic Team

New York (WNS)—When the S. S. Manhattan sailed for Berlin with the American Olympic team on board she carried with her six Jews who will wear American colors in five sports on the Olympic field. The American Jewish Olympians are: Samuel Stoller of the University of Michigan and Martin Glickman of Syracuse University, 400-meter relay; Lt. Harold S. Isaacson of the U. S. Field Artillery at Fort Sill, Okla., equestrian events; Norman Armitage, New York; fencing; Samuel Walter Los Angeles basketball; and Joseph Goldberg, New York, rope climber, gymnastic events. The Olympic team sailed with a deficit of \$57,709.

### Leonard Says Fists Best Aid Against Jew-Baiter

New York (WNS)—Jewish youth in America should learn the art of boxing, because of the ability to handle your fists is perhaps the best insurance against anti-Semitism, Benny Leonard, former world's lightweight champion, told an audience of Jewish communal leaders and athletes gathered to plan for a benefit boxing match to raise funds for German refugees and Palestine.

"The Jewish athlete who is handy with his fists evokes more respect from an anti-Semite than a dozen Jewish scholars, whose leaning the people cannot understand," he said.

## Rabbis Make Plea for Christian Paper

New York (WNS)—Local rabbis have joined with a group of Catholics and Protestant clergymen in issuing an appeal to members of their congregations to contribute \$2,500 still needed to pay off a \$10,000 libel verdict against The Churchman, Protestant Episcopal publication, the oldest Christian periodical in America.

## DON'T BE FOOLED

Don't be fooled! The Fascist anti-Semitic undercover organizations in this country, far from being frightened by the recent exposure of the Black Legion, are mobilizing their forces for a supreme assault on the free democracy of our country.

Sinclair Lewis, Upton Sinclair, the Rev. L. M. Birkhead, Governor Earle of Pennsylvania, Estelle M. Sternberger, who must be regarded as authoritative observers of the American scene, have supplied additional evidence. Anti-Semitism is still used in our political arena without regard to its possible consequences in our country.

The Rev. Dr. Birkhead's statement of a few days ago, in which he said that "if something isn't done to stop it, it will happen here," is so challenging that it would be criminal on the part of our responsible leaders to ignore it.

Dr. Birkhead knows Germany. He studied Hitler when he massed his followers for his successful attack on the German Republic. He studied the ideology and propaganda technique of the Nazis, and now he feels terrified at the similarity of methods used by some American undercover organizations.

Today more than ever would it be necessary for a non-partisan committee to inaugurate a merciless investigation of the activities of every undercover organization suspected of un-American objectives. The inquiry into violations of civil liberties, authorized by the United States Senate, will succeed in its task only if it will set aside all political considerations and expose, condemn and punish without regard for party affiliations.

## Judah Touro Led Dramatic Life In Early Newport Days

Pre-eminent in the life and annals of the colonies and states were Abraham and Judah Touro, sons of Rabbi Isaac Touro:

Abraham was the older, having been born in Newport in 1774. Upon the death of his father, he and his mother, brother Judah, and sister Rebecca, took up their abode in the home of their uncle Moses Michael Hayes in the city of Boston.

Although possessed of much wealth, Abraham Touro appears to have led a somewhat secluded social life, and to have refrained outwardly from participation in public affairs. A descendant writes that, traditionally, the home of Abraham Touro was a gathering place of "good-fellowship" where his friends, numbered among the exceptionally prominent in educational, professional and business life in the city of Boston and other communities, often gathered and were hospitably entertained.

He maintained an interest in the Spanish and Portuguese Congregation, Shearith Israel, in New York, and appears to have donated a substantial sum of money for the construction of a new synagogue by that congregation, and to have contributed other sums from time to time for its support. In a reserved and unpretentious manner, he made provision for the dead poor in Israel and its sick and needy.

**Lived Dramatic Life**  
Judah Touro was born in the town of Newport on June 16th, 1775, and died in the city of New Orleans January 18th, 1854. As already indicated, his boyhood days were spent in the home of his uncle Moses Michael Hayes of Boston. His life appears to have been more dramatic and romantic than that of his elder brother. It is written that in 1796 Judah Touro at the age of twenty-three left Boston as the supercargo of a valuable shipment to the Mediterranean. According to the biographical novel "Judah Touro" by Moses Watreman, the young man became involved in several thrilling and dramatic events.

In October, 1801, Judah Touro left the home of his uncle, and their business relations were terminated. Judah

went to New Orleans, where he arrived in February, 1802. His business ventures, real estate holdings and investments proved profitable, and he became the possessor of a large fortune.

The numerous acts of charity and philanthropy for which Judah Touro became well known during his lifetime were not confined to those of his race or religious affiliation, but extended to all quarters of the world and to all creeds.

**Spirit of Patriotism**  
His spirit of patriotism is illustrated by his act in regard to Bunker Hill monument. Upon learning that Amos Lawrence of Boston had pledged ten thousand dollars towards the completion of the monument, which had been greatly delayed, Judah Touro immediately dispatched to the committee a donation of an equal amount, thus making possible its immediate erection. At the same time he requested that publicity of the gift be restrained—a request which could not under the circumstances, be carried out.

Bearing in mind the ancient Synagogue and cemetery in Newport, the testator provided in his will as follows: "I give and bequeath ten thousand dollars for the purpose of paying the salary of a reader or minister to officiate at the Jewish Synagogue in Newport, Rhode Island, and to employ the ministry of the same, as well as to keep in repair and embellish the Jewish cemetery in Newport aforesaid."

He also bequeathed the sum of five thousand dollars to the town of Newport to be applied in such manner as it may seem best for repairing and preserving the street (Touro Street) leading from the burying ground in said town to the main street.

The Daily News of June, 1854, spoke of his funeral procession as being the longest that had been seen in Newport for many years; that the streets were crowded with people, the stores closed and the bells tolled; that about one hundred and fifty Jews were present from various parts of the country. ## Book Notes

### A Variety of Books

Everyone has a "sure-fire" recipe for dealing with the heat. My own favorite is to find the most endurable spot and stretch out with a book, preferably one not too thought-provoking. In the other hand, you want a book that will hold your attention and keep you from minding the heat.

You might take a journey into the past—the lives of a people who certainly got a "new deal" if ever there was one. I mean, of course, the lives of Peter "Day of the Immense Sun" illustrates what crimes have been committed in the name of exploration and conversion.

If you feel that you know all about New York because you make a few trips a year to see some shows and buy some clothes, you'll be surprised at how much you don't know about the whole state of New York. Carl Carner, who made Alabama as exotic as an orchid, presents to you "York State in Legend and Story." Listen for a lonesome drum—it's even more fascinating and surprising than "Stars fell on Alabama."

Another book about New York, although nothing at all like Carner's book, being a story of a Long Island town in its depression, is Dorothy Blake's "Diary of a Suburban Housewife." It is all the goodness of a tasty apple-pie—the kind that's not too sweet and "gooey."

If you don't mind having your temperaments, or perhaps it is only temper, get up a couple of notches, read either Ferdinand Lundberg's biography "Imperial Hearst" or "Hearst, Lord of San Simeon" by Oliver Carlson and Ernest S. Bates. Better still, read them both, because the latter writer, each of them, is a little bit dangerous to feel sorry for a man who can still do considerable damage; yet the facts of his amazing career show how little the sum total really is.

When you strike a cool day (they do come, sometimes) with a brisk wind that makes you feel ambitious and full of good intentions about "not wasting your time but reading something really worth while and improving your mind" (you have no idea how noble you look as you give vent to these lofty sentiments), borrow your long-suffering neighbor's copy of "The Last Puritan" or "Sparkenbroke," by the new Charles Morgan book. By the way, your neighbor wishes you'd buy a new book once in a while for her to read.

Santayana's lengthy and detailed study of a contemporary world is really not the sort of book to be merely read. One needs to think along with the characters and test the philosophy in the light of one's own critical and intellectual experience. Otherwise, you gain little beyond experiencing English wonderfully handled by a master.

Strangely enough, much the same thing may be said about "Sparkenbroke," by Charles Morgan is another master of English prose. With him, too, the underlying philosophical note, or raison d'être, or whatever term you give to such probing, is infinitely more interesting than a story.

There are many other books on the shelf that suit your taste. Therefore, I have no hesitation in leaving you to follow your own inclinations during the summer. If these reviews have helped you at all in your book selecting, they have been well the effort.

Until next fall, then, pleasant summer and happy reading.

# SEGAL RAPS ZIONIST POLICIES

## Compromise With Arabs And Then Peace Will Come

By Al Segal

I get a great deal of pain from reading what Zionist leaders say from time to time about the tragic events in Palestine.

"They make a sound as of saber-rattlers. Certainly they are not behaving like the sons of prophets when they say truculently: 'Nothing can stop us in Palestine. Immigration into Palestine shall go on. We shall continue to acquire land in Palestine. The Balfour Declaration shall be fulfilled.'"

This is not merely an affront to peace in Palestine. Their brass words serve as a rallying cry, and only several weeks ago 500 Jews of Poland fared forth at one time for a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. One thinks of the rapt children of the crusaders who at the call of priests and monks took up the road to Jerusalem to redeem the Holy Sepulchre, and came only to death.

Isn't it about time to ask: "Where are we going? And is it homeland where the remaining wanderer trembles under the shadow of guns? And by what means can we have peace, or an armistice at least? For this is war."

And Israel is no warrior, no bomb-thrower, no machine-gunner. It is becoming to him that he in his own land shall fulfill his role as prophet of peace.

I am writing as no politician or statesman in Zion, and, indeed, some of my friends say I am a mere ignoramus in the politics of Palestine, and regard me as one who can be no more than an outsider looking in.

As a humble outsider looking in, I am distressed to see Jews perishing on the threshold of the ancestral home. I see neither justice nor humanity in summoning other Jews to Jerusalem while bombs fly and enemies lie in ambush. It is as if to invite men to

make themselves comfortable in a house that is aflame.

I know no leaders of Zion, but I know the idealism that kindles their rashness. It is beautiful to see Israel brave for his ideal even amid bursting bombs and rattling musketry, standing his ground though the heavens fall.

But peace and justice also are ideals of Israel, and from my place on the outside, looking in, I say: "Even more beautiful would it be for Israel to be seen leading the way to peace and justice in his homeland. What wanderer in Israel to be seen closing the hand of his enemy, saying to him: 'Let us try to understand each other, that you and I may arrive at the point of justice.'"

But I should do more than make a gesture of pretty words.

**Method of Procedure**

I should first of all establish an armistice. What do the Arabs desire? Well, they have demanded that Jewish immigration into Palestine cease, that no more land be sold to the Jews.

In the period of our armistice there would be neither immigration nor land purchases. What if for a year even there is no extension of Jewish population in Palestine? Israel has waited 2,000 years and has learned to be patient, and can wait a year longer.

To yield this much is no humiliation of Israel's pride, but an entrenchment of its greatness. He has given in for the sake of peace, justice and humanity.

**Seeks Permanent Peace**

He meets with his enemy to make a permanent peace. He does not stand truculently insistent on what seems to be his right. He dismisses from the start the hope or intention of ever being a majority in Palestine. A wise man, he knows that for him to be the stronger in numbers is only to be weaker, since he brings upon himself the spite of his neighbors.

"Wherein does it profit me," he asks, "to have a majority that lives precariously from day to day by grace of British guns?"

"Better a half million Jews who are safe in Palestine than a million trembling for their lives."

It is enough for Israel that a goodly number of his people are safe in Palestine, making good lives, living at peace with their neighbors, building the country, increasing Jewish learning, living free lives.

On this basis he makes peace.

**Terms of Agreement**

"Let us," he says, "agree on the number of Jews who shall be admitted into Palestine. Let us agree on the number of dunams of land the Jews shall own. Beyond these numbers we shall not increase immigration or own-

## RESENT CHARGES AGAINST LEHMAN

Magazine Board Demands Retraction of Statements

New York (WNS)—A demand that Paul Block, newspaper publisher, discontinue and retract the statement contained in a signed editorial, published as an advertisement in New York newspapers, accusing Governor Herbert H. Lehman of attempting "to bring religion into this campaign" and "to dictate the Jewish vote" was made in a telegram sent by the entire editorial board of the magazine Opinion.

The telegram called Mr. Block's charge "a false and vicious perversion of the truth," and declared that "for any American to commit such an act is shameful. For a Jew to do so is doubly shameful."

Arnold D. Kates, "an ordinary citizen with no axe to grind," published an advertisement in the New York press calling on Mr. Block "to keep religion out of politics" and accusing him of injecting the religious question into New York State politics. "Mr. Block's editorial sounds like Hitler," Mr. Kates said.

ership of land. We desire to live with you in amity, since we know that without peace there can be no happiness of Jews in Palestine."

By these means and for these purposes I would work were I a leader in Zion. I would yield much for the sake of peace, knowing that only by peace can there be fulfillment of the Jewish economic and cultural purpose in Palestine. I should be sad on account of the numbers of afflicted Jews who must be kept out of Palestine in order that peace be maintained; but a realistic understanding of the matter would tell me that it makes no sense to transport Jews from one place of affliction where they may starve to another where they may get shot.

I, as a Zionist leader, would not feel myself to be a postmillennialist coward in giving in, but rather a wise statesman who, discovering he cannot reach his goal, stops half way and considers it an achievement to have gone that far, and makes the best of it.

**Peace by Understanding**

To the reproaches of the irreconcilable portion of Jewry I would answer: "I am not a leader who seeks an objective at whatever expense of lives of other Jews. I am no fool to desire a homeland resting on guns; for only by the precarious authority of guns can we have peace, unless we make peace by understanding."

I might fail in my efforts to make peace by understanding, but would a peace enforced by guns solve anything? Would Palestine be home when the only guarantee of safety is the armed sentry who stands outside the door?

At last, it will be nobler for a Jew to die as one who did his best to make peace with his enemy by yielding than as one cowering for futile protection behind a British gun.

But I do not believe that we can fail by yielding for the sake of peace. Certainly we can only fall into tragic failure by standing stiff-necked, yielding nothing.

## Hebrew Plea For Palestine Made At Labor Congress

## JEW OF COLOMBIA NOW NUMBER 1,500

Have Modern School; Publish Newspaper

New York (WNS)—The Jewish population of the Republic of Colombia is now 1,500. It was reported by Bernard Silverman, Colombian Jewish leader, now a visitor here. Mr. Silverman stated that most of the Jews live in Bogota, the capital, in Medellin and Barranquilla.

In the latter city there is a modern Hebrew school which has official standing and teaches secular subjects. The Colombian Jews publish a monthly periodical in Spanish called "Our Tribune," which will shortly be converted into a weekly.

Colombia's industrial development has been aided by the Jewish settlers, Mr. Silverman said, adding that there is plenty of room for additional Jews, but immigration is now difficult. Nazi propaganda has made some inroads, but the government and people are friendly to the Jews.

The Jewish community is lacking in unity and a Jewish library is urgently needed, he said, asking that contributions of books be sent him in care of Mr. Gray, 43 Leonard street, New York City.

## 200 Jewish Civilians Get Ethiopian Posts

Addis Ababa (WNS)—Two hundred of the 300 Jews enrolled in the 21st Regiment of the Teveria Division, which comprised Jewish volunteers from five countries, have been given civilian posts in the new Italian administration in Ethiopia.

At present the Jewish community here, aside from Jewish officials, consists of 35 Turkish and Egyptian Jews and a handful of German Jewish refugees. The latter include two physicians, Drs. Jacobson and Rudolph Levi, who have not yet been given the right to practice, but expect to obtain this right as soon as they receive Italian citizenship.

## Citizenship for Moslems Heals Breach in Algeria

Paris (WNS)—Restoration of normal relations between Jews and Arabs in Algeria is expected to result from a bill approved by the French cabinet to grant French citizenship to Algerian Moslems. The fact that hitherto only Jews and Christians have been accorded citizenship rights in Algeria was one of the causes of friction between Jews and Arabs.

## PALESTINE RIOTS ENTER 13TH WEEK

Death Toll Now Reaches 200 Mark

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—The 13th week of disorders in Palestine opened with an unidentified number of casualties among a band of 30 Arabs who engaged in a severe battle with military detachments in Northern Palestine. Military reinforcements from Nazareth and Safed kept up a steady barrage against the Arabs, who attacked the troops from ambush.

Arab terrorism rose to new flaring when Isaac Cohen, 64, one of Jerusalem's most distinguished Jews, was fired at twice as he walked past a store on Mamillah Road in Jerusalem. The attacker escaped, but Cohen, whom the bullets struck in the thigh, gave his description to the police.

Violent death claimed its 42nd victim among the Jews when Adam Lipkin, a railway employe at Lydda, was killed when a rifle in the hand of a British soldier accidentally went off while Lipkin was accompanying the soldier to investigate a traffic mishap. Lipkin, who was 22, belonged to an old Jerusalem family, the Abu Bassal quarter here having been named after his grandfather. The soldier was arrested, and an inquiry has been begun by the authorities.

## Greeks Warn Jews to Halt Settlement in Cyprus

Saloniki (WNS)—The reactionary press of Greece has served notice on the Jews that unless they discontinue the purchase of land on the Isle of Cyprus the Greek residents of the island will have to take action to stop them. Cyprus is owned by Great Britain, but the majority of its population is Greek. A large number of German Jews recently settled there.

# RACE PREJUDICE

By Upton Sinclair

Upton Sinclair, outstanding liberal and man of letters, received the other day, an 8-page folder headed with the words: "This is worth reading."

Fearless writer that he is, Mr. Sinclair exports, for the benefit of the Seven Arts Feature Syndicate and "The Jewish Herald," this new evidence of race discrimination by undercover organizations in this country.

—The Editor.

The other day I received an envelope addressed in red ink, marked "personal and important." When I got a letter marked like that I know that it is personal to the other fellow and important to him, but never to me. This one I found had no name, either inside or outside. It was postmarked "Escanaba, Michigan." I learn from the atlas that there are more than thirteen thousand persons in that town, so it would be quite a job to find the writer.

It is an 8-page folder printed on brown paper. Across the top is the statement, "THIS IS WORTH READING," and then comes the heading:

### PROTOCOLS of the meetings of the LEARNED ELDERS OF ZION

Then comes the text interspersed with running comments of some person unknown, and at the bottom of the last page I learn that the price of the document is fifty cents. From my experience with printing jobs, I should assume that in quantities the folder can be produced for half a cent. So you see somebody is making a liv-

ing. Who it is, we are not told. Nowhere on the document is the name of any printer or publisher.

### Secret Organization

Evidently the thing is being peddled around by some secret organization; and it happens that just at the time it came to me there burst out in the newspapers an account of a nightmare organization known as the "Black Legion," which had just murdered a man for attempting to withdraw from it. There are said to be about one hundred and thirty-five thousand members of this Black Legion in the State of Michigan, and undoubtedly there are some of them among the thirteen thousand inhabitants of Escanaba, Michigan.

It appears that this nightmare organization is formed for the purpose of opposing Jews, Negroes, Catholics and Communists, and since it works by terrorism and in the dark, it is to be expected that its literature would bear no means of identification, and that persons who mail it over the country would put no return address on their envelopes.

I do not work in the dark, and I put a return address on my envelopes, and I put the publisher's name on the literature which I send out. What I have to say about the "Protocols of the Learned Elders of Zion" I say here, in a publication which also bears the names of its editors and responsible agents.

### Wretched Fraud

These "Protocols" are a wretched fraud which was contrived by some of the Tsar propagandists of old Russia, to stimulate pogroms for the same reason that the Fascists of Germany and the anti-Semites of America stimulate them—in order to distract the attention of people's minds from their economic troubles, and lead them off on a wild-goose chase. The origin of these "Protocols" has been fully investigated and established in a book which anybody can read in the public library, entitled "The Truth About the Protocols of Zion," by Herman Bernstein, published by Covici Friede, New York City.

There is no more vile and stupid notion now circulated in America than the notion that the Jews are to blame for our present-day troubles. The Jews have their faults, like the other races. They have their scoundrels, as every other group of human beings has. And like all other races and groups of human beings, they have their heroes and their saints, and their great minds. I mention Albert Einstein, and I might mention a hundred others.

There are Jewish bankers, of course, but they are not a bit more greedy than the Gentile bankers, and if anybody doubts that, let him read the book "Upton Sinclair Presents William Fox."

It is true that there are Jews in the New Deal administration, and maybe some of them are giving the President bad advice. But they are not giving any worse advice than many Gentiles whom I could name.

### Cannot Help Race

So much for race prejudice and religious prejudice. People are born Jews and they cannot help it. Many are born Catholics and it is hard for them to help that. The thing to do is to tell them the facts, and explain our troubles, and lead people's minds out of darkness and confusion.

## CHRISTIANS, JEWS MOURN DR. CADMAN

### Was Militant Foe of Nazi Doctrines, Anti-Semitism

New York (WNS)—Christian and Jew alike are mourning the Rev. Dr. Samuel Parkes Cadman, minister, author, lecturer and uncompromising foe of religious bigotry and persecution, who died at Champlain Valley Hospital in Plattsburg at the age of 71.

Known to millions of radio listeners for his radio sermons, Dr. Cadman achieved an international reputation through his lifelong efforts to eradicate racial and religious prejudices.

He was one of the founders of the National Conference of Jews and Christians, chairman of the American Christian Committee for German Refugees and an active supporter of the United Jewish Appeal.

Since the advent of the Nazi regime and its persecutions in 1933 he had been in the forefront of those urging organized Christianity to protest.

Dr. Cadman was a militant opponent of American participation in the Berlin Olympics, and a leader in every movement to uproot anti-Semitic organizations.
