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Fascists Plan Expulsion of Jews

NEW UNEASINESS GRIPS PALESTINE

Arabs Are Deadlocked on Ending Strike

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—The sixteenth week of violence and terror in Palestine has brought with it the same meanness and destruction that marked the first week of the disturbances, despite the fact that Great Britain has appointed a Royal Commission to investigate the disorders.

The Arabs, who considered the Royal Commission over the week-end, have split up in their attitude toward it, some favoring it, but the majority being opposed to the naming of the Commission.

The mysterious slaying of Yehusha Zoller and Yitzhak Klishevsky, two young Jewish watchmen who were found dead in the vicinity of Yokneam near Haifa, brought the toll of Jewish victims to 50 on the 106th day of the organized Arab campaign of violence and sabotage.

Following a fire and rifle attack on the oil pipeline of the Iraq Petroleum Company, the authorities have established rigid curfew regulations in the area from Tamrah in the north near Nazareth to the Jordan River. Curfew will be in force from 6:30 in the evening to four in the morning 300 metres on each side of the pipeline.

The line has been damaged by saboteurs more than half a dozen times in the past fortnight. The Transjordan Government issued new laws for the defence of telephone and telegraph lines and the pipe line of the Iraq Petroleum Company following several attempts in past few weeks to sabotage them.

Mussolini's Aid Sought

By Arabs Who Fear Adverse Decision by Commission

Jerusalem (WNS)—In anticipation of a possible unfavorable verdict by the Royal Commission of Inquiry which is to investigate the Palestinian disorders, Arab political leaders here are reported to be preparing to send a delegation to Rome to attempt to enlist official Italian support for their claims in Palestine. The ostensible object of the visit would be to convey greetings to Mussolini on his conquest of Ethiopia.

Racial Relations Menaced by Professional Champions

London (WNS)—"Professional champions, men who live by exacerbating the stresses between Jew and Gentile, and promoting unjust and unwise boycotts and vindictive discriminations" destroy "all ease of intercourse between Jew and Gentile" and do not allow Jew and Gentile "to adjust to any broader synthesis," it is declared by H. G. Wells in one passage of "Anatomy of Frustration," his forthcoming book.

Mr. Wells asserts that "the Jewish world suffers very gravely" from these professional champions. "They are," he says, "a natural and very unfortunate by-product of the conflict of ancient loyalties with modern gentilities. They trade on the conservative influence of dear and picturesque associations. Every criticism of Jewish tradition is magnified by these mischief-makers into an attack on the race and everyone who opposes an intense isolationism is denounced as the malignant enemy of a sacred and eternal tradition."

BRITISH GOVERNOR ASKED TO AID JEWS

Delegation Seeks Protection for Morocco Jews

Gibraltar (WNS)—Alarmed by reports of programs against the Jews of Spanish Morocco by the Fascist rebels, the Jewish community here sent a delegation to Governor-General Sir Charles Harrington to plead that he use his good offices for the protection of Morocco Jews.

Dispatches received here indicate that the Jews of Spanish Morocco have suffered actual physical violence, that their property has been confiscated, and that hundreds of them are herded in concentration camps because the rebel authorities suspect them of sympathizing with the Spanish government.

Intercepted radio messages indicate that the Fascists are employing Nazi tactics to force Spain against the Jews; Jewish merchants in towns captured by Fascists have been forced to finance the rebel forces.

In Madrid, where the government is holding off a Fascist siege, the anti-Semitic paper A. C. has been seized and converted into a government organ, and much anti-Semitic literature has been confiscated and burned.

ELECT NEWPORT YOUTH TO OFFICE

A. Z. A. Conclave Votes Program of Palestine Work

Los Angeles (WNS)—Pledging a nation-wide campaign of activities in the interests of the Jewish Homeland in Palestine, the Aleph Zadek Aleph, junior B'nai B'rith order, voiced its determination to become the leading Jewish youth organization in this country working for Palestine in a resolution adopted at its 13th annual international convention. Bill Cohen, of Newport, was elected grand councillor from District One.

The 400 delegates decided to cooperate with the Zionist Organization of America and to send their executive secretary, Julius Bino of Omaha, to Palestine next February to organize A. Z. A. chapters there and to see about developing an A. Z. A. forest in the Homeland. A. Z. A. has become established in Bulgaria, the convention was told, and a visitor from Shanghai, China, said he would undertake organization of a chapter in that city.

The convention also voted to make a survey of the problem of directing Jewish youth into professions and jobs that are not overcrowded, and to organize a national vocational guidance board.

Tel Aviv Judges Acquit Shakespeare

Tel Aviv (WNS—Palcor Agency)—A Jewish panel of judges including a magistrate and a number of noted Hebrew authors has adjudged William Shakespeare not guilty of intent to deceive by creating "The Merchant of Venice," and the Habimah Theatre not guilty of resurrecting a libel by presenting the play here.

The Habimah was brought to public trial when many inhabitants of this all-Jewish city objected to its production of the drama, but the judges, far from upholding the charge against the group, declared that Habimah showed courage in presenting the play at a time of racial persecution and libel the world over.

May Seek United Front

New York (WNS)—The presence in Carlsbad, Czechoslovakia, of Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the Jewish Agency, M. M. Ussishkin, head of the Jewish National Fund, and ninety other prominent Jews from Palestine, together with the anticipated arrival of Vladimir Jabotinsky, Revisionist leader, have given rise to rumors that Weizmann and Jabotinsky are negotiating for the establishment of a united Zionist front, according to a Jewish Morning journal cable from Prague. From London the Morning Journal reports that Jabotinsky has had a lengthy correspondence on the same subject with Lord Melchett.

Annenberg Purchases Philadelphia Inquirer

Philadelphia (WNS)—The Philadelphia Inquirer, oldest morning newspaper here, is now the property of Moses L. Annenberg, former executive of the Hearst organization, who acquired it for \$12,000,000. Mr. Annenberg is also the publisher of the New York Morning Telegraph, the Daily Racing Form, the Miami Tribune, the Radio Guide, Screen Guide and Official Detective Stories.

Since 1904, when he was circulation manager of the Chicago Examiner, he has been the publisher of the Wisconsin News, circulation director of all the Hearst publications and publisher of the New York Daily Mirror. He left the Hearst organization in 1926.

"Open Season on Jews" Is Predicted by Pelley

Los Angeles (WNS)—America will have pogroms in the near future, and "pogrom" means simply "open season on Jews," William Dudley Pelley, leader of the silver-shirted Christian Party, told 600 members of the German-American Folk Union at a meeting here in the course of a speech in which he traced the "schemes" of Jews to "Judaize the world" before 1940.

Expressing his full sympathy with the Nazi movement in Germany and endorsing the anti-Semitic sentiments of Hitler, whom he declared to have been chosen by God as the savior of the German people, Pelley announced to his listeners that he too had been divinely chosen to save a great nation—America—from the Jews.

Cites Details

Among the details he cited of the "Jewish plot" to capture America, which he declared was hatched in 1909, was the bringing about of the World War, which, he said, "was set and dried by this group before it ever started. It was their scheme for the Gentiles to kill off each other."

He further explained that the appointment of Louis Brandeis to the Supreme Court bench was the price Woodrow Wilson had to pay for "indifferences" committed with a Jewish woman, that Harding was made President by the Jews

SECRET DOCUMENTS REVEAL PLOTTINGS

Spanish Jews in Turmoil Because of Rebel Papers

Barcelona (WNS)—A second expulsion of the Jews from Spain is one of the cardinal points in the program of the Fascist rebels if, as and when they gain control of the Spanish government, it was revealed in secret documents found in the home of Captain Lopez Varela, rebel leader in Barcelona, according to an announcement by the government of the province of Catalonia.

Word of the discovery caused a shudder in Jewish circles here because of the fact that the papers were found on July 10th, which is 444 years to the day when the last Jews left Spain in 1492 in accordance with the decree of expulsion issued by Ferdinand and Isabella.

Other papers found in Captain Varela's home showed that the Fascists plan to exile all Free-Masons, internationalists and radicals and to set up a dictatorial regime modeled along the lines of Nazi Germany. The late General Jose Sanjurjo, who was killed in a plane crash in Portugal while on his way to assume command of the rebels, was to be named dictator.

Berlin (WNS)—Angered by the violence of Nazi press attacks on the Popular Front Government of Spain, the Spanish Olympic team was officially withdrawn from the Berlin games and ordered to return to Spain.

Jesse Owens, Negro sprinter from Ohio State University, had broken the Olympic record in the quarter-finals of the 100-meter dash; Hitler showed his feeling against non-Aryans by arriving after this event, and again, when he left the stadium rather than greet in person Dave Albritton and Cornelius Johnson, American Negro high jumpers who placed one, two in the high jump final. Previously Hitler had personally welcomed other first place winners from Germany and Finland.

Norma Shearer is Planning Vacation in England

Peter Lorre, Gaumont-British star, is said to be the greatest trans-Atlantic conqueror of the film world; a Hungarian who came to Hollywood via the Grand Studios in Shepherd's Bush, London, Lorre made a British film on each of his trips back to the GB studios.

George Burns and Gracie Allen

In answer to numerous requests that George Burns and Gracie Allen, we are taking the liberty of quoting from an interview with them written for the *Emmanuel* and *Jewish Journal* of San Francisco by Dorothy Lester. In part Miss Lester writes: "We asked him (George, who is Jewish) if he had experienced any religious prejudice on the stage. 'None at all,' was his answer. 'Gracie is Irish and I come from an Orthodox Jewish family. Yet whether we have worked for Jew or Gentile it has made no difference. They have liked or disliked us for what we could or couldn't do, rather than from any prejudiced reason. There is no religion in the arts. Talent alone is what counts, and talent will out.'"

"We have to go back some years for the beginning of this story, to a time when four small boys, hardly old enough to stand on their feet, and known as the 'Peewee Quartette,' accompanied sldies in an East Side New York theatre with their singing. One of them was no stranger to the audiences, for he had danced, sung and acted in saloons, clubs and at benefits ever since they could remember. And George Burns continued entertaining any one who would listen until he borrowed some one's long pants to make his first legitimate stage appearance."

"Whenever he didn't come home at night I knew I'd find him trying out a new dance in the park," his brother, William Burns, now his manager, told Miss Lester.

Meet Sister Team

George and his partner, Billy Lorraine, had been in big time vaudeville for some months and were about ready to break up their act when they met a member of the Allen Sisters dance team, named Gracie. She and George teamed together then, and forgot singing and dancing to carry on a comedy act, with Gracie playing straight roles.

"The gags may have been bad, for I wrote them myself," George Burns said, "but good or bad, it was Gracie, with any line at all, who got the laughs; so we exchanged parts."

After a contract with RKO, during which they performed in vaudeville houses, and also acted in movie shorts, they went to London to appear on the radio for the British Broadcasting Company. When they returned Gracie was a guest star on one of Eddie Cantor's programs.

Fan Mail Enormous

Gracie's fan mail was so enormous that she and George were signed for their first American radio program. That was four years ago, and since that time, although they have changed partners once, they have never missed a week's broadcast, except for one holiday of three months.

After their radio success came movie shorts for Paramount and finally pictures in which they were starred. "We really prefer to be featured as an act in a picture rather than be 'starred,'" said Gracie. "It gives us a better chance to give the public the kind of

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CLERKS PLEDGE ARAB SUPPORT

Wauchope Predicts Early Return to Normalcy

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—During an extensive visit to Jewish settlements in Samaria, High Commissioner Sir Arthur Wauchope told a group of workers and watchmen with whom he was conversing: "I hope the present situation will soon be quieter, enabling you to return to your normal labors."

Arab clerks in all municipalities in Palestine, including Jerusalem, have signed a memorandum pledging their support to the triple program of the Arab Higher Committee, which demands stoppage of Jewish immigration, a ban on land sales to Jews and establishment of an Arab national government.

Daniel Auster, Jewish vice mayor of Jerusalem, has sent a letter to Mayor Hussein Khalidi protesting against the participation of Arab municipal officials in Arab political activities.

18,800 Jewish settlers, 4,000 of them in the capitalist category, entered Palestine during the first seven months of 1936, the Immigration Department of the Jewish Agency announces. This week a single steamer brought 450 Jews here, 300 of them being immigrants coming for permanent settlement.

Nazi Decrees Halt German Exports to United States

Berlin (WNS)—German exports to the United States will be virtually cut off for the time being as a result of two decrees issued here by the Reich foreign exchange board banning the use of Akki marks in payment for goods sold in the United States and prohibiting all private barter agreements in such sales. The decrees are in retaliation for the recent action by the United States in raising tariff rates on German goods sold in the U. S. with the aid of Nazi government subsidies.

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No Compromise

Arturo Toscanini, world famous conductor, again demonstrated his uncompromising resentment at the Nazi treatment of artists and culture creators who do not satisfy the 100 per cent. Aryan test of the Goebbels-Goering crowd. His threat not to conduct the Salzburg Festspiele arrangements were made to broadcast the concerts to Germany forced the cancellation of plans for the broadcast.

It seems that the committee in charge of the broadcasts had consented to eliminate concerts directed by Bruno Walter in order to comply with Nazi regulations that no non-Aryan artist is to be heard or seen in Hitlerland. Toscanini's firm stand aroused the Salzburg promoters to a realization that Toscanini's was more important to them than a broadcast to Germany.

But above everything else this Salzburg radio incident proved that while the political manipulators of Austria and Germany conclude pacts and sign understandings, the world of culture is not ready to compromise with Nazism as long as racial prejudice prevails.

The Royal Commission

The appointment of the Royal Commission to investigate conditions in Palestine and the definition of its functions by Colonial Secretary Ormsby-Gore indicate that the British Government apparently does not take much stock in rumors that anti-Jewish propaganda in Palestine is instigated by foreign powers. It regards the present war status between Arabs and Jews and British military forces as the result of a serious problem which needs to be solved.

The Royal Commission consists of six distinguished British authorities on Colonial Affairs, headed by Earl Peel whose activities in Indian affairs stamp him as an expert negotiator.

Mr. Ormsby-Gore stated that the Commission would not begin its work until order has been restored in Palestine. In other words, the British Government is intent on removing first the effect before inquiring into the cause of troubles in modern Palestine.

British commissions have not achieved great favor with either Jews or Arabs in Palestine on previous occasions. The Royal Commission, however, will receive the full co-operation of the Yishub and its leaders.

Zionist leadership is firmly convinced that any non-partisan investigation of the causes of the disturbances must reveal that Jewish Palestine is innocent of any intrigues against the basic significance of the Balfour Declaration. For this reason world Jewry awaits the work and decision of the Royal Commission with a calm conscience.

It has full confidence that the traditional British fair play will not be swayed by political expediencies.

GARMENT FACTORY OPENS AT COLONY

Labor Shortage Caused by Volume of Orders

Hightstown, N. J. (WNS)—Jersey Homesteads, the Federal Resettlement Administration's combined agricultural and industrial settlement for Jewish needle trades workers from New York and Philadelphia, entered on its second stage of development when scores of garment workers formally opened the colony's model garment factory in the presence of thousands of guests. Overwhelmed by an unexpected flood of orders, the managers of the cooperative enterprise made arrangements for the emergency housing of 92 workers because only eight of the families in the settlement are finished. The eight Jewish houses already settled are each boarding two workers, while the others are being cared for in temporary dormitories.

Youths Picket Parents for Youth Aliyah Money

Stamford, Conn. (WNS)—After picketing their parents' summer home to demand an increased weekly allowance to enable them to contribute more to the Youth Aliyah Fund of Hadassah, Paul and Mark Shulman, 12 and 10 years old, and sons of Mrs. Herman Shulman, national secretary of Hadassah, won their fight. They won a contract which promises them 25 cents for each book they read (during the summer, and interest on a delayed allowance.

Roumania Bans All Anti-Semitic Meetings

Bucharest (WNS)—A decree forbidding all anti-Semitic meetings has been issued by the government, which has also dispatched several battalions of troops to Black Sea vacation resorts to protect Jewish patrons from terrorist bands of Cossacks and Iron Guard. High school students have been forbidden to participate in political activities, in the hope of preventing student attacks on Jews. The ban, however, is not applicable to university students.

For fifteen months it played the Henry Miller Theatre in Manhattan and its record of 504 performances gives it a niche with the most popular stage plays of a decade. Written by Lawrence Riley, a young Bradford, Pa., newspaperman, "Personal Appearance" deals with the strange happenings that attended a tour of Pennsylvania's movie palaces by Carole Arden, a platinum-haired screen actress from Hollywood.

In five years Carole has risen from lunchroom waitress to featured star and as an incident of her rise she has become the wife of Benjamin Z. Fineberg, president of Superfine Pictures, Inc.

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A "Sweet Job"—The Tragedy Of the Noodle Soup Transfusion

The nation's leading comedian here tells in his own inimitable style the story of his operation and recovery. You'll enjoy this as much as a Cantor performance on the stage or screen. We present this sketch by courtesy of Walter Winchell, famous columnist, for whom Eddie Cantor wrote it.

The flood lights were on—the spectators were already seated—the principals began to file in slowly—and as the star was ushered in, instead of the usual blaze of music and din of the crowd, there was a ghastly silence. This Hollywood Opening differed from all others inasmuch as there was no picture to be shown—except the X-ray they took of me two days before.

But let me start from the beginning. For some time I had been complaining of severe chills between my breakfast and lunch. I looked over my list of personal physicians, and, using the enie-menie-minie-mo system, I went to a reliable surgeon.

Have you ever tried to get into the White House to have a little chat with the President. I assure you it's a cinch alongside of getting by the nurse this doctor has. I had to wait two and a half hours before she'd even talk to me. There was one poor fellow sitting there for I don't know how long. All I can tell you is that when he first entered the office he was a child with the mumps—and when he reached the doctor he had to be treated for hardening of the arteries.

History Necessary

She said it was absolutely necessary for her to get a complete history, but the questions she asked pertained not only to history but to geography, spelling and mathematics. Here I was dying, and she was trying to get an education. I finally managed to speak past her into the doctor's private office. I told him what my trouble was, and he proceeded to give me a thorough physical examination. He led me from one room to another, putting me through every known scientific test. I was X-rayed, fluoroscoped, lightmassaged, hydrated, dehydrated, all but cremated.

Pictures Wanted

No sooner was I settled comfortably in a hospital bed than a bunch of photographers rushed in and wanted to take my picture. I begged them to wait until the operation was over, but one bright young fellow said: "Yeah—that's what a lot of them say, and then we don't get a picture."

Heartily enjoying this rare bit of humor, I posed for a hundred and twelve pictures, but I think the one where I did a handstand on the bed post with my feet touching the chandelier will come out best.

The first day passed all right, with nobody to bother me except my own doctor and thirty or forty internes who jabbed needles into me half the time. The other half they pulled them out. The tests had begun. Several hours later they came to make the final blood test and the report came back: No blood. What else could they expect? They took away all I had, and I was anaemic on the first place.

Jokes to the Last

I was wheeled into the operating room and placed on the table. I had strange premonitions that this was the end, and the comic in me kept saying: "Always leave them laughing when you say goodbye." So I thought quickly and said to the doctor: "I may look serious now, doc, but in a few minutes you'll have me in stitches!"

They rolled me over on my stomach and the anesthetic jabbed a needle into the base of my spine. It was a sharp pain and over quickly—like you, sir, it saying "I thought that mink coat"—it

hurts, but what can you do?

The anesthetic took effect—and what an effect. In a little while, from my waist down, I got numb—but a lovely numb feeling, accompanied by a glorious drowsiness. It's hard to describe, except to say that it's a feeling like Joan Crawford kissing you and you can't fight her.

Then the doctors got to work. After they had monkeyed around with me for about an hour the head surgeon peeled off his gloves. The operation was over. I knew it was a success because the other doctors and the spectators started to applaud. For a minute I was scared. What if this guy should decide to take an encore?

Felt Pretty Low

On the way back to my room I felt pretty low, and I couldn't understand why I was taking it so hard. After all, I had had five children and never felt like this.

Mine must have been an unusual case, for several strange doctors walked into my room, lifted my covers, looked at the operation and remarked: "Sweet job." A few minutes later four or five internes entered, lifted the covers, took a look and said: "Sweet job." The hospital superintendent's brother, who was on his way to visit the San Diego Exposition, stopped off to see my operation. He thought it was a sweet job. In six hours I counted over eighty people who thought that Dr. V. had done a sweet job. It wasn't until later that I discovered that Dr. V. was a dentist selling tickets!

Home-made Soup

I wasn't allowed to receive visitors, but my friends didn't forget me. Mrs. Paul Muni, a friend of the family, figured that some home-made noodle soup would do me good, so she sent some up. It was good. The next day Mrs. Joe E. Brown got to thinking that maybe Eddie would like some home-made noodle soup. She sent a bowl.

Mrs. Al Jolson heard that I liked noodle soup, so she sent up quite a large pot, and although I was full of Mrs. Brown's noodle soup, I figured what kind of a guy would I be to turn down Ruby Keeler's, as long as Ruby had gone to the trouble of making it. So I drank hers, too.

Becomes Epidemic

Overnight this noodle soup business became an epidemic. Little stores began to spring up around the hospital—they were all making and selling home-made noodle soup—for one guy, Cantor. My friends suddenly forgot there were such things as flowers, candy, books.

Day by day I was getting stronger. Soon I got up, walked around, and felt it was time to leave the hospital. But they don't let you leave until you've passed the Strength Test. The hospital sends up the cashier with your bill, they let you read it and you don't collapse you're strong enough to leave.

Sudden Illness

My chauffeur came and got me. We were riding merrily along, and just a stone's throw from my house I suddenly felt dizzy. Everything went black—and I fell into a dead faint.

The chauffeur wheeled around, stepped on the gas, and tore through Hollywood traffic back in the direction of the hospital. On the way he collected two motorcycle policemen who, with sirens screaming, blazed the trail to the door. I was rushed to the emergency room, where the doctor opened me once again, and this time discovered 3,485 miles of undigested home-made noodles.

I'm pretty weak now and the doctors have decided upon a transfusion. There's only one trouble. They can't find a donor who can match my type of noodle soup!

BOMBINGS PLANNED BY BLACK LEGION

Would Attack Jewish Meetings and Institutions

Detroit (WNS)—Bombing of Jewish meetings and institutions and the killing of Jews by poison gas and hypodermic needles was seriously considered by the Black Legion, Prosecutor Duncan C. McCrea revealed in making public the declaration of a chemist who had been grilled in connection with the admission of a Black Legion plot to poison Detroit Jewry by infecting milk and cottage cheese with typhoid germs.

According to the statement of the chemist, who was questioned after William Guthrie, Black Legion official, had revealed the poison plot, a high Black Legion official had talked of making bombs to throw into meetings and automobiles, poison gas to be introduced through keyholes of rooms, and needles for injecting poison into people in the streets or in theatres. The chemist asserted that he refused to have anything to do with it.

Incendary Fire Sweeps Lumberyard in Tel Aviv

Tel Aviv (WNS)—An incendary fire that swept over a large area at the edge of the city caused damages estimated at \$25,000. It began in a large lumber-yard which was destroyed. Volunteer firemen extinguished the blaze; police and troops reaching the scene arrested several Arabs after a search had uncovered oil wicks at the scene of the fire.

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Nazis Consider Ban on Jewish Emigration

Berlin (WNS)—Foresadowing an imminent ban on free Jewish emigration from Germany, the Nazi regime is now refusing to renew passports of Jews or to grant passports to those requesting them. Back of this action is a desire to prevent Jews from taking their capital with them and, thereby, further depleting Germany's resources. It is expected that all emigration will be banned shortly.

Berlin (WNS)—The Nazi press has launched a new campaign of vituperation against Switzerland because the government of that country has forbidden the sale of Nazi pamphlets telling the story of the assassination of Wilhelm Gustloff, Swiss Nazi leader, by David Frankfurter, Yugoslavian Jewish medical student.

Anti-Jewish Libel Scotched in Murder of Arab Girl

Jerusalem (WNS-Palour Agency)—An anti-Jewish libel arising out of the murder of a 9-year-old Arab girl at the settlement of Ness Ziona was scotched by the authorities when they discovered that a 13-year-old Arab boy who had accused Jews of killing the child had himself ravaged and choked her.

British Fascists End Blood Libel Agitation

London (WNS)—Facing threats of legal action, Sir Oswald Mosley's Fascist Blackshirts have eliminated the blood libel myth from their anti-Semitic propaganda. This sort of Jew-baiting has recently assumed a serious character. Sir Oswald is seriously ill following an appendicitis operation.

FACISTS IMPRISON JEWS AS HOSTAGES

Hundreds of Shops Looted; Face Economic Ruin

Paris (WNS)—The Spanish Fascist rebels in Spanish Morocco are holding the 15,000 Jews of that province as virtual hostages because they believe them to be in sympathy with the Spanish government, it was reported in dispatches received here from Tetuan and Mellilla. Hundreds of Jewish shops have been looted by Fascist troops and their owners imprisoned for resisting, the reports add.

Face Economic Ruin

Saloniki (WNS)—Sephardic Jewish refugees from Barcelona report that the Jewish community there is facing complete economic ruin as a result of the civil war. The extensive damage caused by the rioting and the dislocation of trade and commerce have been a serious blow to the Jewish business men. The triumph of the government in Barcelona prevented any injuries or deaths among the Jews.

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Polish Anti-Semites Slay 76-Year Old Jewess

Warsaw (WNS)—Mrs. M. Mionovskaya, a 76-year old Jewess, was brutally murdered in the streets of Lodz by a gang of anti-Semites who literally stoned her to death. The aged Jewish woman was walking in the street when she was struck by a barrage of stones.

The sum of 85,000 zlotys (about \$17,000) was raised by the two relief committees organized to furnish aid to the Jewish victims of the recent pogroms in Przystyk and Minsk Mazowiecki, according to reports issued by the committees when they formally disbanded.

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Dickstein Hits Plot of Ex-Secret Service Man

ASKS REVOCATION OF PRIVATE LICENSE

Schemed With Nazis for War on Jews

Washington (WNS)—Revocation of the private detective license of Harold C. Keyes, a former member of the United States Secret Service, because he has been in communication with the German propaganda service in connection with a scheme to "organize Christian Americans against Jews" was asked by Representative Samuel Dickstein in a letter to Edward J. Flynn, Secretary of State of New York.

In a long letter to Mr. Flynn, Mr. Dickstein quoted passages from a letter written by Keyes to German officials which cited his activity in support of his request for annulling his license.

Mr. Dickstein quoted Keyes as saying, among other things, that "in political warfare the Jew is outnumbered by the Christians. . . . But the Christians are not organized nor sufficiently class and race conscious to bestir themselves to stop Jewish encroachments. Leadership is needed badly by our Christian population. We American Christians hate and fear the Jew as much as you do in Germany. We find them just as much a menace as you Germans. . . . But we have been too lazy or indifferent to check the Jew in our midst."

The Keyes letter quoted by Mr. Dickstein also said "it is my contention that Germany has been but half-hearted in its attempts through publicity to crystallize a real opposition to the Jew in America. At heart we in this country are with German aims and ambitions as far as checking the onward march of Jews. The time is ripe right now for a real campaign to 'crystallize' sentiment here. But the publicity work should be in the hands of native Americans . . . with the secret financial support of German Christians. The type of men I would use in such an organization would be chosen for their tactfulness and courage . . . their knowledge of American law . . . and city ordinances pertaining to attacks on friendly nations. Through the collection of real evidence against these groups . . . and the proper presentation of evidence to our courts not even a Jewish judge would dare ignore a complaint."

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ALL JEWS SHUN OLYMPIC GAMES

American Athletes Give Eyes Right on Parade

Berlin (WNS)—Except for the handful of Jewish athletes on the various Olympic teams, Jews were conspicuous by their absence in and around the Olympic stadium as the 11th quadrennial Olympic Games moved into full swing.

Obedying the warning of the Jewish Community News to remain away from the Olympics, the Jews of Berlin stayed at home. Even foreign Jews, exclusive of athletes, were few and far between.

Newspaper correspondents who trained powerful glasses on the athletes down on the athletic field reported that Martin Glickman, Samuel Stoller, Norman Armitage and Herman Goldberg, Jewish members of the American team, kept their eyes turned away from Hitler, as the team passed the reviewing stand.

Turkish Press Calls Werfel "Dirty Jew"

Istanbul (WNS)—A new attack on Franz Werfel, famous Jewish author, has been launched in the Turkish press because of the appearance of a French edition of his famous work, "The Forty Days of Musa Dagh." Calling him "that dirty Jew Werfel" the Turkish papers insist that France should suppress the French edition which also contains Werfel's passionate denunciation of Turkish atrocities against the Armenians.

FINE WINS CHESS TOURNAY
Zandvoort, Holland (WNS)—Reuben Fine, American chess master, won the first in the international chess masters' tournament when he completed the 11 rounds with a record of 8½ won and 2½ lost.

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POEM BY VICTIM SHOWS FORESIGHT

"Replant" Penned by Electrician Before Tragic Death

New York, N. Y. (Special Dispatch)—A document of great human interest reflecting the spirit of Palestine Jewry during the current disturbances, was brought to light by the official gazette of the Tel-Aviv city government.

"Yediath Tel-Aviv," which usually devotes its space to official matters only, publish a poem found among the papers of David Shambadal, one of the first victims of Arab violence. Shambadal who was 29 and an electrician by profession, was stabbed to death in Jaffa on Sunday, April 19th.

In Shambadal's note-book, which contained Hebrew verses on the topic of the electrification of the Holy Land—the author's trade—there was also found a poem which was apparently written by him a few hours before his tragic death. With what appears to have been prophetic foresight, the young electrician-poet took as his theme the attempt of the Arab terrorists to destroy by fire and axe the trees and forests planted on Jewish National Fund land. With poetic intuition, he sang thus:

"PLANT!
Sycamores they cut down
Cedars we shall plant;
Foes in the open
Shall never find us scant.

The vandal of the desert,
Destructive is his hand;
With faith and fortitude
We shall build the Land.

Onward, onward
We shall ever go;
Pave in the desert
Paths, in spite of foe.

Forests are falling,
Fires are aglare—
Plant, plant, plant—
Brothers, no despair."
(Translated from the Hebrew by Philip M. Raskin)

Two months after Shambadal's tragic death, in the middle of June, the Jewish National Fund headquarters in Jerusalem, issued an appeal to Jews everywhere for the planting of 100,000 new trees to take the place of those burned or uprooted by Arab terrorists.

Palestine Riot Refugees Stage Demonstration

Tel Aviv (WNS-Dalcor Agency)—Thousands of refugees of the Arab disturbances staged a demonstration against a Government decision to discontinue relief for them. It has been estimated that at least 3,000 Jews who have taken refuge in this all-Jewish city are in need of public support.

The Government's decision to cut down its allotments for aiding the victims of the disturbances has resulted in the withdrawal of the Community Council from its welfare activities in behalf of the refugees.

The Frolic is also being arranged as a reception to Dr. and Mrs. Myron Keller. Dr. Keller is president of the Jewish Center Council.
