Poland Put on Spot by Congress

BARCELONA JEWS AID RAID ON NAZIS

Hundreds of Jews Held as Hostages in Morocco

Barcelona (WNS)—Nazi propagandists working through schools, athletic organizations and labor bodies were active in 27 cities of Spain and were in close touch with the Fascist rebels, it is charged by La Publicitat, organ of the Catalan government, in reporting the seizure of the headquarters of the Nazi labor organization and the arrest of a score of Nazi agents.

La Publicitat declared that "we consider the seizure of the Nazi headquarters here and the labor from headquarters, which also are Nazi, as perfectly justified. The seizure was made by anti-Nazi Germans together with their Spanish comrades. Records seized in both places allowed the German consulate aided Germans there, and that they received propaganda for Nazi ideas to be put into effect in various parts of Spain."

The term "anti-Nazi Germans" is believed to refer to the German Jewish refugees here, many of whom have enlisted in the government militia.

Nazis Wildly Excited

Berlin (WNS)—The Nazi press, wildly excited over the reported execution of four Nazis in Barcelona by order of the Spanish government, blames it on "Communists and Jews." The Voelkische Beobachter took particular pains to point out that "a Jew from Germany, Frank Arno," had been appointed police chief there.

Hundreds Held as Hostages

Tangier, Morocco (WNS)—While hundreds of the poorer Jews in Spanish Morocco are reported to be held as hostages in concentration camps by the Fascist rebels, the more affluent Jews have been forced to contribute large sums to the rebel cause, travelers from Tetuan and Ceuta assert. They also report that the Fascists in Spanish Morocco are sporting swastika armbands presented to them by officials of the German cruiser Deutschland, which paid a visit to General Francisco Ramon, rebel commander.

Jews Forced to Contribute

London (WNS)—Three of the wealthiest Jews in Spanish Morocco have been forced to contribute 1,000,000 francs to the coffers of the Spanish rebels, according to reports in the London press.

Geneva (WNS-Palcor Agency)—A solemn warning of "the danger that the doors of our Homeland may be closed" was sounded to the World Jewish Congress in a message from David Ben Gurion, chairman of the executive of the Jewish Agency and president of the Palestine Jewish Federation of Labor.

REFUGEES SHOUT FOR GOVT. RELIEF

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—Five hundred Jewish refugees, who fled to the all-Jewish city of Tel Aviv as a result of the Arab attacks in nearby Jaffa, demonstrated in front of the offices of the Palestine Government in Tel Aviv protesting against the withdrawal of government relief for the refugees. "Give us bread and a roof over our heads," was the shout that was heard from the crowd as police dispersed the assembly.

The plight of the Jewish refugees who fled from Jaffa when the disorders began on April 19th is becoming more critical daily, it was revealed in a survey. Their condition became more difficult with the government's decision to discontinue its support toward their maintenance. The Jewish Community itself, as a result of the government's withdrawal, is unable to provide complete aid.

DEMAND REMOVAL OF TALMUD TORAH

Neighbors Claim Students Are "Too Fresh"

North Bergen, N. J. (WNS)—Complaining against alleged all-night parties in the building occupied by the North Bergen residents living in the immediate vicinity have filed a petition with the town authorities demanding the immediate removal of the Talmud Torah as "the center of a public nuisance and a menace to a respectable neighborhood." Fifty residents have signed the petition.

Abraham Rachline, a trustee of the Talmud Torah, denied the charges and called the action "prejudiced and discriminating." There have been a few parties, but none boisterous, in the three years since the Talmud Torah was opened, he said, adding that the noise referred to was the chanting of the cantor and the audible prayer of the worshippers.

A number of Jewish residents also signed the petition, claiming that the Talmud Torah students were "too fresh."

In a hearing on the petition at the City Hall the protesters charged that "Socialism" is being taught in the Talmud Torah. David Goldberg, a teacher at the school, demanded a full investigation, asserting that Nazi influence was behind the charges.

Three More Jews Die

As Palestine Riots Continue into 17th Week

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—Three more Jews, bringing the total of Jewish fatalities to 54, were dead as the Palestine disorders entered their seventeenth week. Reuben Levy, 27, was shot from ambush near the Hatikvah quarter on the Tel Aviv-Jaffa border. Ascher Rosenfeld, 22, was shot by Arabs as he was guarding a Jewish grove in Ness Ziona. Joseph Kaleb, 24, died from wounds sustained during an Arab attack a week before.

As bombings and sniping continued in various parts of the country a British lance corporal was killed and a sergeant wounded in an explosion in a trap along the water pipeline to Jerusalem on the Jaffa highway, where they were doing repair work. Twenty-seven Arab casualties, most of them fatal, resulted from an engagement between Arab and British troops at Shamalia, north of Nablus. One British officer was slightly wounded.

Nazi Curses Jew in Court; Gets Two Days in Jail

New York (WNS)—Herman Melhrsten, a German alien, learned to his regret that Nazi anti-Semitism can't be invoked with impunity in this country when Magistrate Anna M. Kross sentenced him to two days in jail after he had thrown her court into an uproar by hurling anti-Semitic curses at Guss D. Oppenheim, who had had him arrested for disorderly conduct.

While he was being arraigned, Melhrsten broke loose from the arresting officer and tried to punch Oppenheim while shouting epithets. Oppenheim ducked and Melhrsten's fist hit the bench. For this offense he was ordered jailed, where he is awaiting trial on the charge preferred against him by Oppenheim. The latter charges that Melhrsten ran into his store shouting "Hooray for Hitler" and cursing Oppenheim as a Jew.

MEXICO FOILS PLOT

Mexico City (WNS)—An Anti-Semitic Fascist plot against the Mexican government by the Mexican Revolutionary Association (Gold Shirts) was nipped when the police raided the group's headquarters and arrested 16 of its leaders, though its head, General Nicolas Rodriguez, escaped. The headquarters have been sealed.

Presidium Denies Report of Diplomatic Pressure

Work Is Extolled

Geneva (WNS-Palcor Agency)—Intimations abroad that diplomatic pressure had been applied to prevent several delegations attending the World Jewish Congress from describing the true status of Jewish conditions in their countries were proved completely false when the Polish delegation of 47 members presented a documented statement which charged the terrorization and pauperization of the 3,500,000 Jews in Poland.

Angered by the intimation that delegates attending the Congress had been silenced by alleged threats, the presidium issued the following statement: "The presidium of the World Jewish Congress (consisting of fifteen of the leaders from all countries including Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Louis Lipsky, and Max Silverstein of New York) emphatically denies the report that diplomatic pressure had been exerted on any delegation of the Congress. The presidium calls special attention to the statement submitted to the Congress by the united Polish delegation on the condition of Jews in Poland."

Commenting upon recent proposals made by the Polish Foreign Ministry suggesting Jewish emigration from Poland, the document concludes that "Jews will not permit themselves to be terrorized or sunk into demoralization." The declaration of Polish conditions, which was subscribed to by all parties and factions of Polish Jewry, presented a dark picture of the Jewish straits in Poland.

James G. McDonald, of New York, former League of Nations High Commissioner for Refugees Coming from Germany, was extolled for the foundations he had laid to meet the problems of victims of the Nazi regime, in a speech by Sir Neill Malcolm, British successor to Mr. McDonald in the Refugee High Commissioner post.

Introduced to the delegates by Dr. Stephen S. Wise, president of the American Jewish Congress, Sir Neill said that he had come to the World Jewish Congress session to acquaint himself better with the problems confronting the Jewish people, especially with those problems relating to Germany, and to offer assurances that he would do everything to improve their situation.

40 PLAYERS GET PALESTINE ENTRY

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—The Palestine Symphony Orchestra being formed by Bronislaw Huberman, noted violinist, with the aid of American funds, was brought a step nearer realization when the Palestine Government announced that it was making available a special number of 40 immigration certificates for players in the Huberman orchestra, whose concerts are to be launched in October by Arturo Toscanini.

The certificates were part of a batch of 140 received by the Jewish Agency from the special reserve held by the Government; 100 of these additional certificates are to go to German Jewish youth. The Jewish Agency had requested 150 additional certificates outside the 4500 granted for the period ending October.

Favoritism, Politics Blamed For Olympic Discrimination

Berlin (WNS)—Political intrigues and favoritism, if not anti-Semitic prejudice on the part of the American Olympic coaches are blamed for the fact that Sam Stoller and Martin Glickman, the only two Jewish members of the American Olympic track team, were not permitted to run in the 400-meter relay event.

The American 400-meter relay team of Jesse Owens, Ralph Metcalfe, Fay Draper and Frank Wykoff, equalled the world's record for the event in the heat, but this did not prevent American sports writers and fans from expressing amazement at the elimination of Stoller and Glickman.

The two Jewish boys had been practicing with the relay team for ten days and were not told they would be dropped until just before the running of the event.

Takes Full Responsibility

Lawson Robertson, head track coach, took full responsibility for the elimination of Stoller and Glickman, who are the only members of the American team who did not compete in the Olympics. Robertson said he picked the best team. Sports writers, however, pointed out that both Glickman and Stoller had beaten Draper in practice consistently. Owens offered to withdraw to give one of the Jewish boys

a place on the team but he was overruled.

Deny Anti-Semitism

Stoller and Glickman were both quick to deny that Robertson's action was motivated by anti-Jewish feeling. Glickman blamed "politics," saying that the desire of Dean Cromwell, University of Southern California track coach, to give his Californians the best break, was responsible for the elimination of Stoller and Glickman.

The event occurred on Stoller's 21st birthday, and he was so heart-broken he stayed away from the Olympic Stadium. Stoller said "I don't think there was even the slightest question of prejudice involved, but it seems that things were drawn pretty fine when the coaches decided changes were needed to insure victory." Stoller is so broken up over his failure to compete that he intends to quit running altogether, although he still has another year at the University of Michigan.

Spanish Jews Arrested

Warsaw (WNS)—All East European Jews in Spanish Morocco had been arrested by rebels on the charge of Communism, it was reported by two Polish Jews who arrived here from Morocco.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

Samuel R. Finegold

The Penalty Double
A player double for penalties is an opponent's bid when he is reasonably confident that they cannot fulfill their contract. A glance at the method of scoring will readily show how much more is to be gained when you defeat an opponent, doubled or not.

A Double Is Meant for Penalties
1. When his partner has already made a bid, remember that NO MATTER HOW LOW THE CONTRACT, even only one-odd, if your partner doubles AFTER you have made a bid, this double is meant for penalties. Do not take out or run unless you have opened shy, or with a psychic or freak.

2. Now even if one partner has not made a bid, and the double is not made at the doubler's first opportunity to bid. This requires an example:
South East North West
1 Sp pass 2 C pass
2 Sp double
This double is meant for penalties inasmuch as East did not double at his first opportunity to bid. Had he doubled during the first round of bidding it would have been for a take-out.

3. In any case, at first opportunity or otherwise, if the doubled contract is Two No Trump or more, or more than three in a suit. You will recall that, that a double of a preemptive three (or more) calls for optional bidding by his partner. He may take out or he may pass for penalties depending on his holding. This was discussed a few lessons ago.

4. Also (the rare) a double is meant for penalties after a player himself has opened the bidding with No Trump or with a suit and subsequently double's an opponent's bid.

To Double or Not to Double
One hand played in our recent tournament presented a problem to West who can hardly be blamed for doubling with her fairly strong hand. But as is often the case, the double gave us information as to the location of the outstanding strength so that we played for an extra trick by means of a squeeze.

West made her best lead of a low diamond. South won and led a low spade which West took and returned a diamond. South led a low heart which West won with the King and returned a Spade. The Queen of hearts was played followed by another trump to the ace. Trumps were continued for two more rounds and the squeeze started. West discarded the Spade Jack and then the diamond ten, while North let go a low club and then a diamond. The situation now is:

GOLDWYN CANCELS CANTOR CONTRACT

Belle Mitchell Becomes Outstanding Artist

Hollywood, Calif.—After being an issue in Hollywood and on the front pages of the country's newspapers for more than a week, Samuel Goldwyn cancelled his contract with Eddie Cantor. Cantor, who signed with Samuel Goldwyn Productions, Inc., in 1930, said the contract had been terminated by mutual consent. "Our dispute arose because I felt that the delay in starting my current picture was interfering with my radio and theatrical work," the banjo-eyed comedian stated.

From inside sources, it was learned that Goldwyn, who is ill as the result of an operation, felt aggrieved over the contract situation because he had been responsible for the development of Eddie Cantor as a film star since the beginning of the talking films. When Goldwyn engaged him Cantor was appearing in two-reel pictures for Paramount.

What's Going On in the Studios

News bits from the film capital, Hollywood's ubiquitous cameraman, Hyman Fink, has a part in "Hollywood Boulevard". . . Jack Benny is on a diet, so he never eats breakfast when he arises in the morning, but takes time out from work on his new picture for a sizeable meal of bacon and eggs about 11 a. m. He calls it brunch. So a fine Yiddisher boy like Jack likes bacon and eggs! . . . On the first anniversary of 20th Century-Fox Studios, announcement is made that a 4,000,000 expansion program is under way at the Beverly Hills, Calif. studio to provide adequate facilities for an enlarged program of production. Since a merger of 20th Century and Fox Films was effected just a year ago, this studio has come out in front as one of the biggest and most successful of the major producing organizations.

Belle Mitchell Pilgrimage Player

Because of a determination to become an actress, the Pilgrimage Players of Hollywood gained one of its outstanding portrayals. Several years ago a little girl in Detroit named Belle Mitchell decided that she wanted to gain fame and fortune on the stage. During her early school days she studied elocution and dramatic expression, and when 16 years old began playing Shakespearean roles in high school productions.

So successful was Miss Mitchell in these portrayals that she attracted the attention of Al Woods, New York producer, and soon became a full-fledged Broadway star. Under Mr. Woods' management, New York and Eastern theatregoers applauded her in such well-known plays as "Common Clay" and "Parlor, Bedroom and Bath," among others. Her ability was recognized by other New York producers and she was successfully cast for leading roles in "Just a Woman" and "The Heart of Wetons."

About ten years ago Miss Mitchell came to Hollywood. All her time since then has been taken up with parts in prominent stage shows and work before the motion picture camera. One of her first engagements was with "The Pilgrimage Play, now playing a season's run at the open-air Pilgrimage Theatre, opposite the Hollywood Bowl. She is cast in the part of the Samaritan Woman, a role she has played for the past nine years.

Archeological Finds Prove Israelites Invented Writing

London (WNS)—Evidence that the ancient Israelites of Palestine antedated the Phoenicians in the knowledge of writing and authenticating proof of the veracity of the Old Testament were uncovered by the staff of the Wellcome Archeological Expedition at the Bible city of Lachish, it was reported by Sir Charles Marston on his return from Palestine. Discoveries at Lachish proved that the Sinai Alphabetical writing had been used there a century after Moses. Script found on pottery dug from the Lachish ruins showed that the Israelite script was the parent of Phoenician writing, from which our modern alphabet is derived, Sir Charles said.

Arabs Ready to Mediate Three Major Arabic Rulers Ready for Solution of Problem

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—The three major Arabic rulers, Ibn Saud of Arabia, King Ghazi of Iraq and the Imam Yehia of Yemen, are ready to offer their services as mediators in the disturbed Palestine situation, according to rumors circulated here today.

The sovereigns of nearby Arab territories have been appealed to for aid by local Arab leaders since the revolt against British policy in Palestine started on April 19th, but this is the first time that any indication has been given that they are sufficiently interested in the Palestine problem to join in an attempt at a solution.

The Arab sovereigns are reported to be ready to make a public appeal for the cessation of the campaign of terror and the general strike, after which they will mediate between the Palestine Arabs and the British Government.

The Arab Higher Committee, which has directed the general strike, is said to have inquired of the three kings what guarantees they would offer for the fulfillment after the restoration of order of the three principal demands: stoppage of Jewish immigration, ban on land sales to Jews and the establishment of a national Arab government.

DANZIG COURT UPHOLDS BOYCOTT

Danzig (WNS)—Continuing its defiance of the League of Nations, the Nazi-controlled government of the Free City of Danzig has ruled that the anti-Jewish boycott is legal. The ruling was made by the Free City's supreme court in a decision resulting from Jewish protests against the public display of posters urging the boycott of Jews. The supreme court said bluntly that the protest was illegal because the boycott was in harmony with the Nazi party's program. The Jewish community had lodged a protest with the League of Nations.

London (WNS-Palcor Agency)—"The civilized progress of the Jew is essential for the Arab," Sir William Flinders Petrie, renowned archeologist, declares in a letter published in the Times. "The root of the present question is the use of land, which has been mostly cultivated by the Arabs but which, if properly cultivated, could hold four-fold the present population," he further said.

Expresses Appreciation

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—The Arabic daily Falastin, in an editorial expressing appreciation of the efforts of Emir Abdullah of Transjordan to bring about a settlement of the present situation says that "The Arabs desire with all their hearts the termination of the present situation, since its continuation is liable to destroy the economic ground under their feet. The English also desire its termination, owing to the pressure of Arab propaganda in the Arab and Moslem world."

Dr. Berger Commends Boyman's Outburst

Also Outlines Plans for Congress and Local Zionists

Aboard the S. S. Queen Mary—One more day and we land at Cherbourg. This steamer is certainly a marvel of beauty, size, appointment and comfort. Almost every one who travels on this line, claims that the Queen Mary vibrates so much more on account of its speed, that one finds it hard to write.

There are about fifty delegates and alternates on this steamer going to Geneva. We have had three meetings, attended by all delegates, and presided over by Louis Lipsky. Participating in the debates were Abraham Goldberg, S. Margoshis, Professor Isaac Harris, Professor Feinman, Louis Segal-Wertheim, Mr. Geller, Mendel Fisher, Philip Fatah, Rabbi Shalom of Boston, Laes Reiter, myself and a half dozen more whose names are not so familiar.

Here are men leaving their homes and comforts to travel thousands of miles, at their own expenses, in try to help solve the puzzling and tragic situation in which our fellow Jews find themselves in many lands of Europe. And why are they doing it? It is the absolute duty of those who are able and who qualify amongst our people, to sacrifice, if necessary, for their means to bring some measure of comfort to our afflicted brothers.

Must Be Alert
We are living in America in complete security, guaranteed us by the Constitution, but we must be alert to any changes that may take place which will jeopardize our own position.

And here, is the American Jewish Congress to defend our rights in America and the rights of Jewry outside of America. The Congress will play an important role in our lives, and who knows, on the lives of all Jewry the world over.

At the meetings we had on the boat, we discussed the possibility of the American delegates taking the leading part in moulding a World Jewish Congress, which will remain our contribution to the next generation. The finances will have to be provided. We have no means of knowing by what method this will be done. We will have to have a representative in Geneva, one in London, and maybe in Paris, with a research committee to handle all problems regarding our troubles, and how to prevent them.

I am grateful to Mr. Boyman for the part he played at this dinner, but I am sorry to know that having appointed two boycotting committees in my two terms of office, nothing tangible was done by them.

I hope on my return we shall put all our efforts to a successful boycott, as the only means at our disposal to defeat Hitler's purposes by economic strangulation. The nations are getting closer to Germany for their own protection and we are left unprotected even by the liberal world, so let us defend ourselves by the only means at our disposal—economic boycott.

Hopes for 1,000 Members
And now about Palestine. We have made an excellent beginning, to increase the strength of our membership in our state. I hope that we will go further and build the largest and strongest unit in the Zionist Movement. One thousand members should be our minimum goal. I am reading a book published by the Jewish Publication of America, "The Jews in Germany."

I believe that every one ought to read this book, and see why we must have a Palestine, and why we must fight to build up a larger Palestine, and the reason for a stronger Zionist Movement, as strength and numbers count in world politics, including England. I appeal to all our people in Rhode Island to take your place, which rightfully belongs to you—at the head of the movements. On my return let us have one large meeting attended by at least 1000 members.

Would Teach Talmud To German Children

Berlin (WNS)—A proposal that the contents of the Talmud and the Shulchan Aruch be taught in all the German elementary schools in order to teach German children what sort of people the Jews really are was made by Col. Ulrich Feischbauer, the Nazi expert at last year's "Protocols of Zion" trial at Berne, Switzerland, in a lecture at Munich University. Teaching of the Talmud and Shulchan Aruch in German Universities is expected to begin next year.

REVEALS DETAILS OF SEPT. POGROMS

New York (WNS)—Boasting that weapons and forces are ready, the first pogrom against American Jews is threatened some time in September by James True, of the James True Associates and America First, Inc., of Washington, D. C., according to revelations quoting True which appear in the current issue of the New Masses.

The New Masses discloses it has placed the evidence concerning the proposed massacre before President Roosevelt, the La Follette Senate Investigating Committee and the Superintendent of Metropolitan Police of Washington, D. C., with the demand for steps to stop the planned pogrom as well as future activities of anti-Semitic organizations such as True's which incite to violence.

Fingering a revolver, True in his Washington office told Porter Niles, author of the New Masses article, as related in the magazine: "We're getting set! We're preparing for September. When we have the pogrom, not even our 'pet Jews' will stay alive. And he repeated that the massacre will come 'around September.'"

ASK BOYCOTT OF ROYAL COMMISSION

Jerusalem (WNS—Palcov Agency)—The General Council of the World Zionist Organization, which will meet in Zurich on August 25th, should formally resolve to refuse participation in the sessions of the forthcoming Royal Commission of investigation of the disorders in Palestine in the event that Jewish immigration is suspended in the meantime, it was asked in a resolution adopted by the Palestine Council of the right wing ("Group B") General Zionists.

This body will direct its appeal for non-cooperation to the General Council when it convenes, and subsequently to the Administrative Committee of the Jewish Agency, which meets immediately after the Zionist sessions. It is also urged that measures be taken to return the Revisionists to the fold of the World Zionist Organization, from which they seceded in year ago on the grounds that the World Zionist Organization's political policy was too timorous.

Nazi Students Lectured On Racial Equality by Professor

Cambridge, Mass. (WNS)—Improving on the old adage of casting pearls before swine, Dr. Kirley F. Mather, director of the Harvard Summer School, lectured a group of Nazi high school students touring New England on race equality and academic liberty when he welcomed them to Harvard.

While the German students and their mentor, Dr. Otto Kunz of the Amerika-Institute in Berlin, an organization for spreading Nazi propaganda through students, sat stolidly, Dr. Mather rebuked the Nazi theory of race superiority by asserting that no one race is the sole repository of wisdom, virtue and ability, and pointed out that at Harvard "we believe that all kinds of people have contributed to make the modern civilization."

Lecturing the Nazi students on the virtues of liberty, untrammeled thinking and academic freedom, Dr. Mather hit directly at Nazi restraints when he said that "to enjoy liberty, to be free is a more difficult task in this century than it has been in any previous century in the history of Harvard or of mankind in general."

"We at Harvard don't tell people what to think; we help them to learn how to think for themselves. We believe that the only way to solve this conflict between the individual and the group in which he must live is to develop the ability for each individual to think for himself and to reach conclusions which are wise for him to reach."

Norway Rejects Nazi Plea to Expel Trotsky

Oslo, Norway (WNS)—While the Nazi press continued its attacks on Leon Trotsky, exiled Communist leader, and demanded his immediate expulsion, the Norwegian ministry of justice completely absolved Trotsky of alleged charges of engaging in revolutionary activity. The ministry of justice investigated the charges after a group of Nazis had raided Trotsky's home during his absence and stolen some allegedly incriminating documents.

Anti-Semitism and Reaction

That the fight against anti-Semitism is important not only for Jews but for all liberty-loving elements was made clear by Dr. Stephen S. Wise in his opening address before the World Jewish Congress at Geneva.

"Whether or not the world recognizes it, whether or not Jews understand it, anti-Semitism as a world problem is one of the major problems of civilization," he declared before the nearly three hundred delegates gathered in the League of Nations Assembly Hall, driving home his point with the statement that "if Hitlerism had been faced by the world when it was little more than an anti-Semitic election expedient it is doubtful whether the entire civilized world would be called upon, as today, to face ever-growing terror of the increasing barbaric power of Nazi Germany."

A similar note was struck by Dr. Nahum Goldmann, the distinguished German editor who is now a refugee from the Nazi regime, when he pointed out that "throughout the world whatever is anti-liberal and anti-democratic is nearly always anti-Semitic."

In every country there are too many Jews who do not realize that, while liberalism and anti-Semitism do not mix, reaction is quick to call the mob-inflicting expedients of racial or religious prejudice to its aid.

Too many Jews lend their support to reactionary parties without realizing that by so doing they are digging their own graves. Freedom of political, social and economic outlook is, of course, a sine qua non of democracy.

But if Jews possess even half of the wisdom with which their enemies credit them it is incomprehensible that even a single Jew should choose to join the camp of those who are potential—if not actual—foes of Jewry.

Sam Stoller Comes of Age

Sam Stoller celebrated his twenty-first birthday last week not by helping the American Olympic team win the 400-meter relay race, as he had expected, but in pondering over the injustice of the world.

Sam and his only Jewish team-mate, Marty Glickman, were eliminated from the race in a last-minute revision of the American line-up, victims of a political move on the part of the powers that be.

Both boys have made statements making clear their certainty that the politics involved was not of an anti-Semitic nature and that no prejudice was involved in their elimination from the race for which they made the trip to Berlin.

But this did not dull their sense of disappointment; in fact they might have preferred it if they had been told that it was their Jewishness—which they would never deny—rather than any suspected lack of speed—a suspicion which they resent, and justly, if their records are any criterion—which kept them out of the race.

In any case, Sam Stoller has now reached his majority in more than years. His bitterly disillusioning experience, coming on the day which he had long anticipated as a doubly important milestone, has no doubt brought him wisdom.

For if his stay in Naziland has taught him anything—and we imagine that he has learned a great deal there—it has taught him that in a Nazi atmosphere even sports become contaminated with politics.

Edinburgh (WNS)—Dr. Max Borne, distinguished Jewish philosopher who was invited from his post in Germany, has been appointed to the faculty of the University of Edinburgh.

BAR COMMUNISTS FROM CONGRESS

Leaders Show Diversity of Opinion On Question

Geneva (WNS-Palcor Agency)—The World Jewish Congress, found itself plunged into a heated debate even before the sessions started when American Jewish leaders, elected as representatives of American Jewry, demanded that five Communists, who had been elected at a left-wing conference in New York, should be barred from the ten-day sessions which will consider the political, economic and social position of world Jewry.

The American delegation adopted a resolution calling upon the Executive Committee of the World Jewish Congress to deny seats to the five Communists, but not before the American leaders had shown a diversity of opinion among themselves in regard to the merits of the Communist claim to participation in the Congress.

Dr. Stephen S. Wise, President of the American Jewish Congress, and Louis Lapsky, Vice-President, emphasized during the caucus of the Americans that the political views of the Communists were not the basis for their exclusion, which rests solely on the Communist support of Arab attacks on Jews in Palestine.

New Black Legion Fanning Says Convicted Member

Detroit (WNS)—A "new and greater" Black Legion is in the process of organization by the "better element" of the secret terrorist order which has thus far not been involved in the crimes charged against it, it was asserted by Earl Augustad, one of the three Black Legion members found guilty of falsely imprisoning fellow members.

Augustad, who was convicted in the first trial since the Black Legion's activities were uncovered, declared in a statement made in his cell that important people are lacking the new organization, convicted with Augustad were Thomas F. Cox and Frederick A. Gully, who were found guilty of falsely imprisoning Robert Penland. These three on trial were acquitted.

Lith-Reich Trade

Pact Blow to Jews

Kovno (WNS)—The new commercial treaty between Lithuania and Germany is expected to cause an annual loss of 20,000,000 lire (\$1,400,000) to Jewish business men here, according to estimates by informed Jewish leaders. The loss will result from the fact that German purchases here will eliminate Jewish middlemen and brokers. The treaty has already been responsible for the government forbidding the Jewish press to criticize the Nazi regime.

FINDS STRADIVARIUS VIOLIN

Saranac Lake, N. Y. (WNS)—After giving an impromptu ten minute concert on a violin borrowed from James Robinson, his 84-year old guide, Professor Albert Einstein told the amazed guide that he believed the instrument to be a Stradivarius.

"Such a violin," the Professor murmured after playing it on the wharf where his sailboat was anchored. The Einsteins are spending the summer here.

Answer Hitler In His Own Terms, Says Ludwig

MUST NOT MINCE WORDS OR ACTIONS

Believes Assimilation Period Is Now Ended

Geneva (WNS-Palcor Agency)—Asserting the need for mobilization of the Jewish people "to resist the war of anti-Semitism directed against them and to combat the ravages of the world war to come," Emil Ludwig, famous biographer, called upon Jews to answer Hitler "in the same terms as he addresses to us."

Dr. Ludwig uttered these views in an exclusive interview as he prepared to leave the sessions of the World Jewish Congress, which he has been attending, for a trip to South America.

Born in Jewish Faith

Explaining that he was born in the Jewish faith but brought up as a non-Jew, although unbaptized, Emil Ludwig described how he came to identify himself with Jews. "Many persons," he said, "have become Jews since Hitler. I have been a Jew since the murder of Walter Rathenau, from which date I have emphasized that I am a Jew. I have been interested in the World Jewish Congress for the last four years. I see in it the instrument which will prepare the Jewish people to resist the war of anti-Semitism directed against them and to combat the ravages of the world war to come."

Assimilation Era Ended

Referring to those who have absented themselves from the Congress, Dr. Ludwig said: "The era of assimilation is ended. The sooner Jews realize that the better for them. I am waiting to hear from this platform the answer given to Hitler in the same terms as he addresses to us. We must not mince words or be weak in action."

"I am a very superstitious person and I cannot think of this assembly as a first world congress. When the second session has been held I will remember that this was the first. Above all there must be continuity and no interruption in the labors which we have undertaken. I do not believe in totalitarian states for Jews or others, but I urge with all the emphasis at my command that party divisions be forgotten. All the forces in Jewish life must be consolidated to resist the war upon us."

State Exposition Seeks Industry's Oldest Employee

The Exposition management also announced that they would present permanent passes to all veteran employees with records of service of 40 years or more, and that complimentary single admissions would be given to all those with 30-year records.

C. J. France, Vice Chairman of the Exposition's Executive Committee, said today in announcing the project, "We are finding a very interesting situation as we begin our search for oldest living industrial employees. It is, I think, a great tribute to the stability and dependability of Rhode Island industry to discover that many of our old established concerns have employees, either active or retired, with records of service going back forty, fifty and sixty years."

Cardinal Leads Fight

Against Anti-Semitism in Belgium With Warning to Catholics

Brussels (WNS)—Under the leadership of Cardinal Joseph Ernest Van Roey, head of the Catholic Church in Belgium, there has been organized here a non-partisan committee which issued a public manifesto to Catholics warning them against anti-Semitism. The committee endeavored to undertake an organized campaign of propaganda among Catholics to counteract the anti-Semitic activities of the Rexist Party.

Creates Stir

Prague (WNS)—A great stir has been created throughout Czechoslovakia by Bishop Hlinko, leader of the Slovakian People's Party, because of a public denunciation he made against anti-Semitism. In his statement he warned the Catholic press to stop its anti-Jewish propaganda.

Lithuanian Jewish Chess Players Go to Olympics

Kovno (WNS)—Ignoring the bitter protests from Jewish leaders, the Jewish chess champions of Lithuania have gone to Germany to participate in the chess tournament at the Olympic Games. As a concession to the protests the Jewish players promised not to play against Nazis.

Gruenbaum is Under Fire for Urging Emigration

Warsaw (WNS)—Isaac Gruenbaum, former member of the Polish Sejm and now a member of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, has become the butt of a bitter attack by the entire Jewish press here because of his assertion that Jewry has no future in Poland and must emigrate en masse.

Gruenbaum's remark has been seized upon by the anti-Semitic press as justification of its anti-Jewish attacks. The Jankiel Nardow, organ of the anti-Semitic extremists, said sarcastically that the Palestinian air had shown even Gruenbaum the truth.

Gruenbaum meant to say that anti-Semitism is so deep-rooted in Poland that Jews simply cannot exist here. The anti-Semitic press, however, distorted his words and interpreted them as an endorsement of their demand for Jewish mass emigration.
